A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	Part I
2	SECTION 1. The purpose of this part is to prohibit the
3	transfer of moneys out of the state highway fund for non-highway
4	purposes.
5	The legislature finds that this Act is necessary to ensure
6	that moneys in the state highway fund are expended only for
7	state highway projects as intended. The legislature believes
8	that the highway infrastructure needs a guaranteed source of
9	funding. The legislature also finds that public confidence in
10	government is lessened if moneys intended for highway projects
11	are diverted to other uses.
12	This Act does not affect any provision concerning the
13	authorized revenues of or expenditures from the county highway
14	funds. The legislature intends to honor the principle of home
15	rule in this respect.
16	SECTION 2. Section 37-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended to read as follows:

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"§37-53 Transfer of special funds. At any time during a
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    fiscal year, notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any
    department [may,] with the approval of the governor or the
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    director of finance if so delegated by the governor, may
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    transfer from any special fund relating to such department to
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    the general revenues of the State all or any portion of moneys
    determined to be in excess of fiscal year requirements for such
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    special fund, except for special funds under the control of the
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    department of transportation relating to highways, airports,
    transportation use, and harbors activities, special funds under
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    the control of the Hawaii health systems corporation or
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    subaccounts under the control of its regional system boards, and
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    special funds of the University of Hawaii. At any time the
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    department of transportation, with the approval of the governor
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    or the director of finance if so delegated by the governor, may
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    transfer from any special fund, other than the state highway
    fund, under the control of the department of transportation, or
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    from any account within any such special fund, to the general
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    revenues of the State or to any other special fund, including
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    the state highway fund, under the control of the department of
    transportation all or any portion of moneys determined to be in
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    excess of requirements for the ensuing twelve months determined
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1	as prescr	ibed by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91; provided
2	that no s	uch transfer shall be made [which] that would cause a
3	violation	of federal law or federal grant agreements."
4	SECT	ION 3. Section 248-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended t	o read as follows:
6	"§24	8-9 State highway fund. [-(a)] Moneys in the state
7	highway f	und may be expended for the following purposes:
8	(1)	To pay the costs of operation, maintenance, and repair
9		of the state highway system, including without
10		limitation, the cost of equipment and general
11		administrative overhead;
12	(2)	To pay the costs of acquisition (including real
13		property and interests therein), planning, designing,
14		construction, and reconstruction of the state highway
15		system and bikeways, including, without limitation,
16		the cost of equipment and general administrative
17		overhead;
18	(3)	To reimburse the general fund for interest on and
19		principal of general obligation bonds issued to
20		finance state highway projects where the bonds are
21		designated to be reimbursable out of the state highway
22		fund; and

1	(4)	To pay the costs of construction, maintenance, and			
2		repair of county roads; provided that none of the			
3		funds expended on a county road or program shall be			
4		federal funds when such expenditure would cause a			
5		violation of federal law or a federal grant agreement.			
6	[-(b)	At any time, the director of transportation may			
7	transfer	from the state highway fund all or any portion of			
8	available	moneys determined by the director of transportation to			
9	exceed on	e hundred thirty-five per cent of the requirements for			
10	the ensui:	ng twelve months for the state highway fund as			
11	permitted	by and in accordance with section 37-53. For purposes			
12	of the de	termination, the director of transportation shall take			
13	into consideration:				
14	(1)	The amount of federal funds and bond funds on deposit			
15		in, and budgeted to be expended from, the state			
16		highway fund during the period;			
17	(2)	Amounts on deposit in the state highway fund that are			
18		encumbered or otherwise obligated;			
19	(3)	Budgeted amounts payable from the state highway fund			
20		during the period;			
21	(4)	Revenues anticipated to be received by and			
22		expenditures to be made from the state highway fund

1	during the period based on existing agreements and
2	other information for the ensuing twelve months; and
3	(5) Any other factors as the director of transportation
4	<pre>shall-deem appropriate.]"</pre>
5	Part II
6	SECTION 4. The purpose of this part is to generate
7	additional sources of revenue that may be expended for the
8	operation, maintenance, and repair of the state highway system
9	SECTION 5. Section 251-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
11	"(b) There is levied and shall be assessed and collected
12	each month a tour vehicle surcharge tax of:
13	(1) $[\$65]$ \$ for each tour vehicle used or partially
14	used during the month that falls into the over
15	twenty-five passenger seat category; and
16	(2) $[\$15]$ \$ for each tour vehicle used or partially
17	used during the month that falls into the eight to
18	twenty-five passenger seat category.
19	The tour vehicle surcharge tax shall be levied upon the
20	tour vehicle operator."

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- 2 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 3 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2040.

State Highway Fund; Various Amendments; Tour Vehicle Surcharge Tax

Description:

Repeals provisions authorizing transfers of revenues deemed excess out of the state highway fund; replaces the tour vehicle surcharge tax of \$65 for each tour vehicle that falls into the over 25 passenger seat category, and \$15 for the 8 to 25 passenger seat category, with unspecified surcharge amounts. (SB3149 SD3)
