A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The Legislature has made it a priority to find SECTION 1. 2 solutions to Hawaii's predicted long-term care crisis based on 3 the state's rapidly aging population. Many families in Hawaii 4 choose to care for elderly or disabled family members in their homes rather than a facility. However, in-home care does not 5 6 allow the same financing options through Medicaid as licensed 7 nursing facilities. Additionally, the medical needs of the 8 person being cared for may change, thereby requiring a different 9 type of care. 10 It is the intent of the Legislature to promote independence 11 and choice by providing individuals who are eliqible under 12 Medicaid to receive nursing facility care the full spectrum of 13 service options available, including the following: (1) Admittance to a nursing facility;

- 15 (2) The option to remain in the individual's community and 16 receive home- and community-based long-term care, 17 support, and services; and

4	SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
6	and to read as follows:
7	"§346- Medicaid funds; transfer. (a) The department
8	shall transfer Medicaid funds from a nursing facility or long-
9	term care based facility to home- or community-based long-term
10	care, support, and services, when an individual chooses to
11	remain in the individual's community or to relocate from a
12	nursing facility to receive home- and community-based long-term
13	care, support, and services.
14	(b) The costs for home- and community-based services may
15	not exceed, on an average per capita basis, the total
16	expenditures that would have been incurred if the individual
17	received facility-based long-term care, services, or support.
18	(c) The department shall establish rules pursuant to
19	chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this section."
20	SECTION 3. The department of human services shall apply
21	for all waivers and grants necessary to implement this Act.
