## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EXTENDED SENTENCING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 706-662, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§706-662 Criteria for extended terms of imprisonment. A
4	defendant who has been convicted of a felony may be subject to
5	an extended term of imprisonment under section 706-661 if it is
6	proven beyond a reasonable doubt that an extended term of
7	imprisonment is necessary for the protection of the public and
8	that the convicted defendant satisfies one or more of the
9	following criteria:
10	(1) The defendant is a persistent offender in that the
11	defendant has previously been convicted of two or more
12	felonies committed at different times when the
13	defendant was eighteen years of age or older;
14	(2) The defendant is a professional criminal in that:
15	(a) The circumstances of the crime show that the
16	defendant has knowingly engaged in criminal
17	activity as a major source of livelihood; or

- (3) The defendant is a dangerous person in that the defendant has been subjected to a psychiatric or psychological evaluation that documents a significant history of dangerousness to others resulting in criminally violent conduct, and this history makes the defendant a serious danger to others. Nothing in this section precludes the introduction of victim-related data to establish dangerousness in accord with the Hawaii rules of evidence;
- (4) The defendant is a multiple offender in that:
  - (a) The defendant is being sentenced for two or more felonies or is already under sentence of imprisonment for any felony; or
  - (b) The maximum terms of imprisonment authorized for each of the defendant's crimes, if made to run consecutively, would equal or exceed in length the maximum of the extended term imposed or would equal or exceed forty years if the extended term imposed is for a class A felony;
