A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CANCER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that the Hawaii breast SECTION 1. 2 and cervical cancer control program was established in 1997 to 3 provide breast and cervical cancer screening. Since that time, 4 the Hawaii breast and cervical cancer control program, 5 administered by the department of health, and the breast and 6 cervical cancer treatment program, administered by the 7 department of human services, have worked together to help screen and treat women in Hawaii for breast and cervical cancer. 8 9 Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, was amended in 2001 10 to provide for a breast and cervical cancer treatment program to 11 be administered by the department of human services for women 12 who are not eligible for federally-funded medicaid coverage as 13 provided by the Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Act of 2000. Act 278, Session Laws of Hawaii 2001, 14 15 also provided funding for the breast and cervical cancer 16 treatment program. In addition to this treatment program, it is necessary to allow part of the funding to be used for breast and 17



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cervical cancer screening, education, and outreach by the
 department of health in order to reach more women who are
 eligible to be screened under the screening program and thereby
 be eligible to be treated under this treatment program.

5 The purpose of this Act is to provide funding for breast 6 and cervical cancer screening, education, and outreach to the 7 department of health to reach more women who are eligible to be 8 screened for breast and cervical cancers.

9 SECTION 2. Section 346-59.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended to read as follows:

"[+]§346-59.2[]] [Breast] Comprehensive breast and 11 12 cervical cancer [treatment] control program. (a) There is 13 established the comprehensive breast and cervical cancer 14 [treatment] control program, to be administered by the 15 department of human services $[\tau]$ in collaboration with the 16 department of health, to assist women who have been diagnosed 17 with breast or cervical cancer by the Hawaii Breast and Cervical 18 Cancer Control Program, but who are not eligible for federallyfunded medicaid coverage as provided by the Breast and Cervical 19 Cancer Prevention and Treatment Act of 2000. 20

(b) Under the <u>comprehensive</u> breast and cervical cancer
[treatment] <u>control</u> program, the department <u>of human services</u>



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1	shall provide state-funded medical assistance, as appropriated
2	by the legislature, to women who are diagnosed with breast or
3	cervical cancer through the Hawaii Breast and Cervical Cancer
4	Control Program, but who are not eligible for federal medicaid
5	coverage; provided that the person either:
6	(1) Is a resident alien of Hawaii who is not eligible for
7	medicaid; or
8	(2) Would be eligible under medicaid except that the
9	person has health care coverage that specifically does
10	not provide coverage for cancer treatment.
11	(c) The department of health shall work collaboratively
1 2	with the department of human services to assist in and the
13	support of screening, education, and outreach process regardless
14	of a woman's eligibility for medicaid coverage.
15	(d) Under the comprehensive breast and cervical cancer
16	control program, the department of health shall provide state-
17	funded medical assistance, as appropriated by the legislature,
18	to:
19	(1) Screen women for breast and cervical cancer;
20	(2) Educate women regarding the risks associated with
21	breast and cervical cancer; and

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1 (3) Provide outreach to women who are at risk for breast

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and cervical cancer."

3 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii to the department of human services for the comprehensive breast and cervical cancer 5 6 control program, pursuant to section 346-59.2, Hawaii Revised 7 Statutes, the sum of \$150,000 or so much thereof as may be 8 necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for cervical and breast 9 cancer screening, education, and outreach shall be transferred 10 to the department of health for the purposes specified under 11 this Act.

SECTION 4. The department of health and the department of human services shall submit an annual report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session on the expenditure of all funds for the comprehensive breast and cervical cancer control program.

17 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
