A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IMMIGRATION CONSULTANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by		
2	adding a new chapter under title 25 to be appropriately		
3	designated and to read as follows:		
4	"CHAPTER		
5	IMMIGRATION CONSULTANTS		
6	§ -1 Declaration of policy. It is the policy of the		
7	State to prohibit persons who have no training or experience in		
8	immigration law from rendering advice on an immigration issue or		
9	preparing immigration documents in exchange for consideration.		
10	These acts have resulted in serious and oftentimes irreversible		
11	prejudice to thousand of residents who seek to apply for or		
12	depend on immigration benefits.		
13	§ -2 Prohibited acts. It shall be unlawful for any		
14	person, in exchange for, or in consideration of money, services,		
15	or other valuable consideration to:		
16	(1) Give or render any opinion or advice on any		

immigration problem or issue; or

1	(2)	Prepare, draft, write, make, or fill-in any
2		immigration related form, document, or paper.
3	§ .	-3 Persons not covered. This chapter shall not apply
4	to any of	the following persons:
5	(1)	Any person who is duly licensed to practice law in
6		this State and who is in good standing;
7	(2)	Any officer or employee of the United States
8		Citizenship and Immigration Services;
9	(3)	Any person who is accredited by the Board of
10		Immigration Appeals; and
11	(4)	Any paralegal or other employee of any attorney who is
12		duly licensed to practice law in this State, who
13		prepares, drafts, writes, makes, or fills-in any
14		immigration related form, document, or paper; provided
15		that:
16		(A) The paralegal or other employee works under the
17		direct supervision of the attorney; and
18		(B) The attorney makes a certification duly signed at
19		the end of the immigration form, document, or
20		paper, or attachment thereto, as follows:
21		"I certify that the within or attached
22		document has been prepared under my direct

1 supervision and that I have read and 2 reviewed the same." -4 Penalty. (a) Any person who commits any 3 S 4 prohibited act under this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than \$50 or more 5 6 than \$1,000 for each violation. 7 The department of commerce and consumer affairs may 8 seek all legal and equitable remedies available to it for the 9 enforcement of the provisions of this chapter, including seeking 10 injunctive relief." SECTION 2. If any provision of this Act, or the 11 12 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 13 applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the 14 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 15 16 of this Act are severable.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
