## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that agriculture will
- 2 continue to play a vital role in Hawaii's efforts to become more
- 3 self-sustainable. Agriculture not only contributes to the
- 4 State's economy by providing employment opportunities, products
- 5 for export, and a stage for tourism, but also performs a public
- 6 service by helping to perpetuate a rural lifestyle for Hawaii's
- 7 residents who, in turn, provide stewardship for Hawaii's lands
- 8 and water.
- 9 With the demise of the plantations that once controlled
- 10 vast acres of pineapple and sugarcane fields, there is a need to
- 11 promote the diversification of Hawaii's agriculture industry.
- 12 Hawaii must also diversify its economic base beyond a reliance
- 13 on tourism. A revived and revitalized agriculture industry
- 14 promises not only to achieve this objective but also to sustain
- 15 and stabilize Hawaii's food supply and protect the open space
- 16 and lifestyle that both residents and visitors value.
- 17 Currently, Hawaii's agriculture and value-added product
- 18 industry contributes \$2,400,000,000 to the State's economy and



- 1 employs more than 38,000 people. Over the past 20 years, the
- value of diversified agriculture in Hawaii has more than 2
- doubled, reaching a record \$370,900,000 in farm-level revenues 3
- 4 in 2002.
- 5 The agriculture industry should continue to explore new
- opportunities as prime agricultural land becomes available. At 6
- present, about 100,000 acres of former sugarcane and pineapple 7
- 8 land--prime agricultural land--lie fallow. Recent estimates
- 9 suggest that if all this land could be put to productive use
- through successful agricultural ventures, an additional 10
- \$1,700,000,000 to \$4,400,000,000 could be infused into the 11
- 12 State's economy.
- To take advantage of these opportunities and to provide the 13
- necessary support for the overall transition of Hawaii's 14
- agriculture industry from plantation agriculture to diversified 15
- agriculture, more resources must be directed toward agricultural 16
- research and development. Agricultural research is key to 17
- maintaining Hawaii's competitiveness in an agricultural market 18
- 19 that is becoming increasingly global.
- 20 The legislature finds that the Hawaii Agriculture Research
- 21 Center, the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture
- 22 and human resources, the department of agriculture, and the





- 1 United States Department of Agriculture Pacific Basin
- 2 Agricultural Research Center should work collaboratively to
- 3 expand their agricultural research efforts. These research
- 4 organizations are critical to the State's efforts to strengthen
- 5 and improve the agriculture industry, expand employment
- 6 opportunities for residents, and revitalize the economy.
- 7 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii Farm Bureau
- 8 Federation is a non-profit agricultural organization
- 9 representing the interests of, and exemplifying a strong
- 10 commitment to, the agriculture industry in Hawaii and can ensure
- 11 that agricultural research and marketing meet the needs of local
- 12 farmers and ranchers. The Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation has
- 13 frequently partnered with institutions like the Hawaii
- 14 Agriculture Research Center, the University of Hawaii college of
- 15 tropical agriculture and human resources, and the department of
- 16 agriculture on many research and market development projects.
- 17 The Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation has also worked with many
- 18 other kinds of commodity organizations, including sugar,
- 19 pineapple, papaya, macadamia, coffee, flower, fruit, vegetable,
- 20 aquaculture, seed corn, forestry, and livestock organizations to
- 21 formulate research needs for the entire agriculture industry.
- 22 Therefore, the legislature finds that the most logical



- 1 organization for agricultural research and market development in
- 2 the state is the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for a grant
- 4 to the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation to conduct agricultural
- 5 research and development.
- 6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for a
- 9 grant, pursuant to the provisions of chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised
- 10 Statutes, for the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation to conduct
- 11 agricultural research and development.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
