A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HARBORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Ţ	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Act 127, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, is
3	amended by amending section 1 to read as follows:
4	"SECTION 1. To meet the economic needs of the [state,]
5	State, the harbors division of the department of transportation
6	must provide suitable harbor facilities[7] and birthing piers,
7	which in turn ensures the efficient and timely delivery and
8	shipment of goods imported into the [state.] State. Ocean
9	surface transportation is the State's lifeline. It remains the
10	only viable means to service the lion's share of Hawaii's
11	economic needs. However, Hawaii's aging commercial harbor
12	system has not kept pace with our growing economy, and Hawaii's
13	commercial ports statewide are experiencing competition for
14	berthing rights for cargo, fuel, and cruise ship activities and
15	severe congestion in harbor facilities. It is recognized by the
16	harbor users, state administration, and the legislature that it
17	is now extremely critical to upgrade existing port facilities

- 1 and develop harbor improvements in an expedited manner. The
- 2 Hawaii harbor users group, a maritime transportation industry
- 3 group, was formed in 2005 because the industry recognized that
- 4 Hawaii is facing a shortage of port facilities statewide. Its
- 5 goal is to help the State identify and prioritize Hawaii's
- 6 harbor improvement needs. The Hawaii harbor users group has
- 7 completed research that predicts that if Hawaii's harbor
- 8 infrastructure is not improved, the loss of real domestic
- 9 product (in 2007 dollars) could amount to more than
- 10 \$50,000,000,000 by the year 2030. In comparison, an assessment
- 11 of immediate commercial harbor needs statewide is estimated to
- 12 cost in the range of \$850,000,000.
- 13 Under its statutory mandate, the harbors [division's focus
- 14 is on division focuses on essential daily management and
- 15 operations of the commercial harbor system rather than
- 16 development of new expansion opportunities. To expeditiously
- 17 develop critically needed harbor infrastructure improvements and
- 18 curtail statewide economic hardships that will occur if the
- 19 harbors reach maximum cargo handling capacity by the year 2011
- 20 as currently projected, the harbors division [desires to
- 21 partnered with Aloha Tower development corporation, an
- 22 entity with a development-oriented mission, statutory powers,



and expertise in the development of state-owned properties [-], 1 for development of Honolulu harbor pursuant to this Act. 2 3 The harbors division is additionally stymied by the lack of 4 funding necessary to develop costly wharfs and cargo handling 5 terminals and its [inability] traditional structure limits its ability to consider development-oriented financing options such 6 as public or private partnerships [under its traditional 7 structure], but the Aloha Tower development corporation is 8 empowered to do such things. A partnership with the Aloha Tower 9 10 development corporation, which has jurisdiction over a portion of Honolulu harbor, can also assist the harbors division by 11 12 providing financial support from its limited commercial 13 development along the downtown urban waterfront. Revenues 14 generated from commercial development are proposed to be directed towards the funding of commercial harbor system 15 16 infrastructure improvements. 17 In consideration of the recognition by the key harbor users, the administration, and the legislature that 18 19 extraordinary means must be employed to catch up on deferred 20 harbor infrastructure development, the legislature finds that the harbors division should be given further development tools 21

to accomplish the formidable task of bringing the State's

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    commercial harbors up to the standards needed to sustain
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    economic growth.

10	<u>(c)</u>	For the purpose of this section, the chief executive

13	and qualifications, and fix their salaries, without regard to		
14	chapter 76;		
15	(d)	The harbors modernization group shall include	
16	additiona	1 members to the development corporation board of	
17	directors	for the purpose of directing the planning, design,	
18	construct	ion, and financing of the harbor projects identified in	
19	the comme	rcial harbors modernization plan. Should projects	
20	identifie	d in the commercial harbors modernization plan involve	
21	land disp	osition matters, including but not limited to, land	
22	acquisiti	on, leasing, conveyance or acquisition of easements or	
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- 1 rights-of-ways, such land disposition matters shall continue to
- 2 be governed under chapter 171, under the jurisdiction of the
- 3 board of land and natural resources.
- 4 (e) The harbors modernization group shall retain all the
- 5 powers of the Aloha Tower development corporation under sections
- 6 206J-5 through 206J-21.
- 7 (f) Six additional voting members shall, except as
- 8 otherwise provided in this subsection, be appointed to the
- 9 development corporation by the governor to comprise the harbors
- 10 modernization group for four year terms pursuant to section
- 11 26-34. These members shall act and be counted in determining
- 12 quorum and majority only with respect to duties under the
- 13 harbors modernization group as described in section (d). Quorum
- 14 and majority for the harbors modernization group shall be
- 15 defined as a majority of members from the development
- 16 corporation plus four of the six members added by this
- 17 subsection to form the harbors modernization group. These
- 18 members shall serve without compensation, but each member shall
- 19 be reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, incurred
- 20 in the performance of their duties. These members shall consist
- **21** of:

1	(1)	The director of budget and finance, or a respective
2		designated representative, who shall serve as an
3		ex-officio voting member;
4	(2)	Two public members from the maritime industry; and
5	(3)	The mayors of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai,
6		or their respective designated representatives, who
7		shall serve as ex-officio voting members.
8	All membe	rs shall continue in office until their respective
9	successor	s have been appointed. The chairperson of the harbors
10	moderniza	tion group shall be the chairperson of the development
11	corporati	on.
12	[(c)] (g) Subject to existing contractual and statutory
13	commitmen	ts to the department of transportation for any losses
14	in revenu	e under this chapter, the development corporation may
15	apply any	revenues derived from commercial development projects
16	in the Al	oha Tower project area to defray the cost of harbor
17	infrastru	cture improvements incurred within the State.
18	(h)	Any moneys or funds under the management of the
19	harbors m	odernization group shall be deposited into the harbor
20	special f	und pursuant to section 266-19 upon the repeal of this
21	section."	

1 SECTION 5. The department of transportation is authorized to issue harbor revenue bonds for harbor capital improvement 2 projects authorized in section 6 of this Act and designated to 3 4 be financed by revenue bond funds or by general obligation bond 5 funds with debt service cost to be paid from special funds, in 6 such principal amount as shall be required to yield the amounts 7 appropriated for such capital improvement program projects, and, 8 if so determined by the department and approved by the governor, 9 such additional amounts as may be deemed necessary by the 10 department to pay interest on such revenue bonds during the 11 estimated construction period of the capital improvement project 12 for which such harbor revenue bonds are issued to establish, **13** maintain, or increase reserves for the harbor revenue bonds or 14 harbor revenue bonds heretofore authorized (whether authorized and issued or authorized and still unissued), and to pay the 15 expenses of issuance of such bonds. The aforementioned harbor 16 **17** revenue bonds shall be issued pursuant to the provisions of part III of chapter 39, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as the same may be 18 amended from time to time. The principal of and interest on 19 harbor revenue bonds, to the extent not paid from the proceeds 20 of such bonds, shall be payable solely from and secured solely 21 22 by the revenues derived from harbors and related facilities



- 1 under the ownership of the State or operated and managed by the
- 2 department, including rents, mooring, wharfage, dockage,
- 3 pilotage fees, and other fees or charges presently or hereafter
- 4 derived from or arising through the ownership, operation, and
- 5 management of harbor and related facilities and the furnishing
- 6 and supplying of the services thereof. The expenses of the
- 7 issuance of such harbor revenue bonds shall, to the extent not
- 8 paid from the proceeds of such bonds, be paid from the harbor
- 9 special fund.
- 10 The governor, in the governor's discretion, is authorized
- 11 to use the harbor revenue fund to finance those projects
- 12 authorized in section 6 of this Act where the method of
- 13 financing is designated to be by harbor revenue bond funds.
- 14 SECTION 6. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
- 15 be sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated herein, are
- 16 hereby appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from the
- 17 harbor revenue bond funds for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 18 2008 and ending June 30, 2012. The sums appropriated shall be
- 19 expended by the department of transportation for the purposes of
- 20 this Act. The department of transportation, as expending
- 21 agency, shall delegate to the development corporation the
- 22 implementation of the capital improvement projects authorized in



- 1 this Act and subsequent acts, for the projects identified as the
- 2 commercial harbors modernization plan. After approval of the
- 3 project by the director of transportation and the governor,
- 4 expending authority for the approved projects shall be delegated
- 5 to the development corporation.

17	biennium for which the appropriation is made; provided that all
18	appropriations which are unencumbered as of June 30, 2012, shall
19	lapse as of that date.

SECTION 7. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 2 3 and to read as follows: "§266- Hana ramp and wharf; jurisdiction. Any law to 4 5 the contrary notwithstanding, the department of transportation shall have jurisdiction and administrative authority over the 6 7 previously operational pier portion of the area designated as 8 Hana ramp and wharf; provided that the portion of the Hana ramp 9 that is utilized as a small boat ramp facility and maintained by the department of land and natural resources shall remain under 10 the control of the department of land and natural resources 11 pursuant to part I of chapter 200. This area is located on the 12 easterly end of the island of Maui, fifty-nine miles from 13 Kahului and consists of one pier and one ramp." 14 SECTION 8. All appropriations, records, equipment, 15 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, 16 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, 17 acquired, or held by the department of land and natural 18 resources relating to the functions transferred to the 19 20 department of transportation shall be transferred with the 21 functions to which they relate.

- SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon approval; 3
- provided that part I of this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 4
- 5 2016, and sections 206J-2 and 206J-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 6 are reenacted in the form in which they read on the day before

7 the effective date of this Act.

Harbors; Modernization Plan; Capital Improvement Projects; Revenue Bond; Hana Ramp and Wharf Transfer

Description:

Expands the authority of the Aloha Tower development corporation to assist in the development of the statewide harbors modernization plan; authorizes the DOT to issue revenue bonds to finance the harbor improvements; transfers the pier portion of Hana ramp and wharf to DOT.
