A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$5-19[+] Description of the Hawaiian flag. The

4 official description of the Hawaiian flag as authorized to

5 represent the State of Hawaii on land and sea, and authorized

6 for executive state agencies, second to the stars and stripes of

7 the United States shall be:

(1) The Hawaiian flag shall consist of eight horizontal stripes, alternately white, red, blue, [etc.,] beginning at the top, having a jack cantoned in the

dexter chief angle next to the point of suspension;

(2) The jack shall consist of a blue field charged with a compound saltire (crossing) of alternate tincture white and red, the white having precedence; a narrow

edge of white borders each red side of the saltire;

(3) A red cross bordered with white is charged (placed)

over all;

1	(4)	The	proportion shall be as follows:
2		(A)	The fly (length) is twice the hoist (width);
3		(B)	The jack is half the hoist (width) in breadth and
4			7-16 the fly in length;
5		(C)	The arms of the red cross with border shall be
6			equal in width to one of the horizontal stripes;
7			the white border shall be one-third the width of
8			the red cross;
9		(D)	The arms of the compound saltire (crossing) are
10			equal in width to the red cross, the tinctures
11			white, red, and the border being in the
12			proportion of 3, 2, 1, respectively.
13	When	the	Hawaiian flag is flown from the same halyard as
14	the flag o	of the	e United States of America is flown, it shall be
15	underneath the national colors.		
16	The Hawaiian flag shall not be used to cover a platform or		
17	speaker's desk, nor to drape over the front of a speaker's		
18	platform.		
19	When	the l	Hawaiian flag and the flag of the United States of
20	America are displayed on a speaker's platform at the same time,		
21	the Hawaiian flag shall be on the left side of the speaker, the		

- 1 speaker's left, while the flag of the United States of America
- 2 is on the right side of the speaker, the speaker's right.
- 3 When the Hawaiian flag is used to cover a casket, it shall
- 4 be [so] placed so that the jack is at the head and over the left
- 5 shoulder. The flag shall not be lowered into the grave or
- 6 allowed to touch the ground.
- 7 To fold the Hawaiian flag ceremoniously, first fold it
- 8 lengthwise, bringing the striped half up over the jack. Then
- 9 repeat, with the jack on the outside. Beginning at the lower
- 10 right, make a series of triangular folds until the flag
- 11 resembles a cocked hat with only the jack visible.
- 12 The Hawaiian flag shall be flown at half-mast by first
- 13 raising it to the top of the flagpole, and then slowly lowering
- 14 it to a position one-fourth of the distance down the flagpole,
- 15 and there leaving it during the time it is to be displayed. In
- 16 taking the flag down, it shall first be raised to the top of the
- 17 flagpole, and then slowly lowered with appropriate ceremony.
- 18 When the Hawaiian flag is in such condition of repair that
- 19 it is no longer a suitable emblem for displaying, it shall be
- 20 totally destroyed, preferably by burning, and that privately; or
- 21 this shall be done by some other method in keeping with the

- 1 spirit of respect and reverence that all owe the emblem that
- 2 represents the Aloha State of Hawaii."
- 3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
