A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that early instruction in physical education is important to the long-term health of Hawaii's citizenry. Contemporary physical education instruction 3 goes beyond playing games and learning the rules to promoting 4 and furthering the understanding of healthy physical activity 5 6 habits. The purpose of this Act is to promote public school 7 students' long-term physical health. 8 SECTION 2. (a) With regard to public school education, 10 the department of education shall:
- 11 Establish programs and activities that promote a (1) commitment to lifelong physical activity and decreased 12 sedentary behavior, including the development of 13 after-school and summer programs, which shall be 14 15 taught by licensed physical education teachers beginning with the 2007-2008 school year; 16

1	(2)	Define and implement a developmentally appropriate
2		course of study for physical education instruction in
3		grades kindergarten through six that is taught by at
4		least one licensed physical education teacher per
5		school by school year 2012-2013;

- (3) Implement physical education instruction that is generally in accordance with the standards established by the National Association for Sports and Physical Education as a core requirement for grades seven and eight; and
- (4) Assist and allow high school principals to grant specialized credit for participation in after-school athletic activity and other co-curricular activities by school year 2008-2009; provided that a licensed physical education teacher shall certify that the activity is generally in accordance with the standards established by the department of education for physical education instruction.
- (b) The department of kinesiology and leisure at the
 University of Hawaii, the department of education, and the
 Hawaii teacher standards board shall work together to establish

- 1 and implement appropriate policies and programs to actively
- 2 recruit, train, and license physical education teachers.
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
- 6 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 7 year 2008-2009, for the establishment of after-school and summer
- 8 programs and activities that shall be taught by licensed
- 9 physical education teachers beginning with the 2007-2008 school
- 10 year.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 12 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$65,000, or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 16 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 17 2008-2009, for the establishment and implementation of
- 18 appropriate policies and programs to actively recruit, train,
- 19 and license physical education teachers.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 21 of education for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$65,000, or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
- 4 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 5 2008-2009, for the University of Hawaii, department of
- 6 kinesiology and leisure, to hire one additional faculty teaching
- 7 position to increase the University of Hawaii's capacity to
- 8 recruit and train physical education teachers.
- 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 10 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 12 provided that sections 3, 4, and 5 shall take effect on July 1,
- 13 2007.
