## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that upon hiring, new
- 2 teachers do not receive credit for coursework completed in
- 3 excess of that necessary to attain a bachelor's or master's
- 4 degree. Therefore, these teachers do not receive any financial
- 5 enhancement, although they have completed coursework beyond
- 6 their degrees that may also be directly related to teaching in
- 7 their specific subject matter areas or fields.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 9 education to conduct a study on the number of and the extent to
- 10 which newly hired teachers are adversely affected by the
- 11 inability to receive credit for coursework completed in excess
- 12 of that required for their degrees.
- 13 SECTION 2. The department of education shall report to the
- 14 legislature on the number of newly hired teachers with a start
- 15 date of August 1, 2007, or later, who possess either bachelor's
- 16 or master's degrees and credits in excess of those degrees for
- 17 which they will not receive credit from the department of

- 1 education in determining their salary or position
- 2 classification. The report shall also include information on
- 3 the types of credits earned, the number of credits in excess of
- 4 degrees earned, the subject matter areas of the credits earned,
- 5 the relevance of the credits earned to teaching, and the cost
- 6 impact of providing compensation to those teachers with excess
- 7 credits. The department of education shall submit its report to
- 8 the legislature on the foregoing no later than twenty days prior
- 9 to the convening of the regular session of 2008.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
