A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCIES.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 201B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§201B-A Tourism emergencies. (a) If the board
5	determines that an adverse effect on Hawaii's tourism industry
6	resulting from world conflict, terrorist threat, natural
7	disaster, or the outbreak of disease regardless of when or where
8	occurring, resulting in a substantial interruption of commerce
9	of the State and adversely affect the welfare of its people, it
10	shall submit a request to the governor to declare that a tourism
11	emergency exists.
12	(b) Upon declaration by the governor that a statewide
13	emergency exists triggering a tourism emergency pursuant to
14	subsection (a), the authority may develop and implement measures
15	to respond to the tourism emergency; provided that any tourism
16	emergency response measure implemented pursuant to this
17	subsection shall not include any provision that would adversely
18	affect the organized labor force in tourism related industries.

- 1 §201B-B Tourism emergency trust fund. (a) There is 2 established outside the state treasury a tourism emergency trust 3 fund to be administered by the board as trustee, into which shall be deposited the revenues prescribed by section 4 5 237D-6.5(b). All investment earnings from moneys in the trust 6 fund shall be credited to the tourism special fund. (b) Moneys in the trust fund shall be used exclusively to 7 provide for the development and implementation of emergency 8 9 measures to respond to any adverse effects on the tourism 10 industry resulting from world conflicts, terrorist threats, 11 natural disasters, or the outbreak of disease that may result in a substantial interruption of commerce of the State and 12 13 adversely affect the welfare of its people, pursuant to section 14 201B-A. (c) Use of the trust fund, consistent with subsection (b), 15 shall be provided for in articles, bylaws, resolutions, or other 16 17 instruments executed by the board as trustee for the trust 18 fund." SECTION 2. Section 201B-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 20 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: "(a) Except as otherwise limited by this chapter, the 21 22 authority may:
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1	(1)	Sue and be sued;
2	(2)	Have a seal and alter the same at pleasure;
3	(3)	Make and execute contracts and all other instruments
4		necessary or convenient for the exercise of its powers
5		and functions under this chapter; provided that the
6		authority may enter into contracts and agreements for
7		a period of up to five years, subject to the
8		availability of funds; and provided further that the
9		authority may enter into agreements for the use of the
10		convention center facility for a period of up to ten
11		years;
12	(4)	Make and alter bylaws for its organization and
13		internal management;
14	(5)	Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, adopt rules
15		in accordance with chapter 91 with respect to its
16		projects, operations, properties, and facilities;
17	(6)	Through its executive director represent the authority
18		in communications with the governor and with the
19		legislature;
20	(7)	Through its executive director, provide for the
21		appointment of officers, agents, and employees,

subject to the approval of the board, prescribing

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1		their duties and qualifications, and fixing their
2		salaries, without regard to chapters 76 and 78 if
3		there is no anticipated revenue shortfall in the
4		tourism special fund and funds have been appropriated
5		by the legislature and allotted as provided by law;
6	(8)	Through its executive director purchase supplies,
7		equipment, or furniture;
8	(9)	Through its executive director allocate the space or
9		spaces which are to be occupied by the authority and
10		appropriate staff;
11	(10)	Engage the services of qualified persons to implement
12		the State's tourism marketing plan or portions thereof
13		as determined by the authority;
14	(11)	Engage the services of consultants on a contractual
15		basis for rendering professional and technical
16		assistance and advice;
17	(12)	Procure insurance against any loss in connection with
18		its property and other assets and operations in such
19		amounts and from such insurers as it deems desirable;
20	(13)	Contract for or accept revenues, compensation,
21		proceeds, and gifts or grants in any form from any
22		public agency or any other source, including any

1		revenues or proceeds arising from the operation or use
2		of the convention center;
3	(14)	Develop, coordinate, and implement state policies and
4		directions for tourism and related activities taking
5		into account the economic, social, and physical
6		impacts of tourism on the State and its natural
7		resources infrastructure; provided that the authority
8		shall support the efforts of other state and county
9		departments or agencies to manage, improve, and
10		protect Hawaii's natural environment and areas
11		frequented by visitors;
12	(15)	Have a permanent, strong focus on marketing and
13		promotion;
14	(16)	Conduct market development-related research as
15		necessary;
16	(17)	Coordinate all agencies and advise the private sector
17		in the development of tourism-related activities and
18		resources;
19	(18)	Work to eliminate or reduce barriers to travel in
20		order to provide a positive and competitive business
21		environment, including coordinating with the

1		department of transportation on issues affecting
2		airlines and air route development;
3	(19)	Market and promote sports-related activities and
4		events;
5	(20)	Coordinate the development of new products with the
6		counties and other public sectors and private sectors,
7		including the development of sports, culture, health
8		and wellness, education, technology, agriculture, and
9		nature tourism;
10	(21)	Establish a public information and educational program
11		to inform the public of tourism and tourism-related
12		problems;
13	(22)	Encourage the development of tourism educational,
14		training, and career counseling programs;
15	(23)	Establish a program to monitor, investigate, and
16		respond to complaints about problems resulting
17		directly or indirectly from the tourism industry and
18		taking appropriate action as necessary;
19	(24)	Develop and implement emergency measures to respond to
20		any adverse effects on the tourism industry, pursuant
21		to section 201B-A;

1	[(24)]	(25) Set and collect rents, fees, charges, or other
2		payments for the lease, use, occupancy, or disposition
3		of the convention center facility without regard to
4		chapter 91;
5	[-(25)]	(26) Notwithstanding the [provisions of] chapter 171,
6		acquire, lease as lessee or lessor, own, rent, hold,
7		and dispose of the convention center facility in the
8		exercise of its powers and the performance of its
9		duties under this chapter; and
10	[(26)]	(27) Acquire by purchase, lease, or otherwise, and
11		develop, construct, operate, own, manage, repair,
12		reconstruct, enlarge, or otherwise effectuate, either
13		directly or through developers, a convention center
14		facility."
15	SECT	ION 3. Section 237D-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
17	"(b)	Revenues collected under this chapter shall be
18	distribute	ed as follows, with the excess revenues to be deposited
19	into the o	general fund:

8		deposited into the tourism emergency trust fund,
9		established in section 201B-B, sufficient to maintain

12		chapter shall be transferred as follows: Kauai county
13		shall receive 14.5 per cent, Hawaii county shall
14		receive 18.6 per cent, city and county of Honolulu
15		shall receive 44.1 per cent, and Maui county shall
16		receive 22.8 per cent.
17	All	transient accommodations taxes shall be paid into the
18	state trea	asury each month within ten days after collection and
19	shall be l	kept by the state director of finance in special
20	accounts	for distribution as provided in this subsection."

- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.

Allows the Hawaii tourism authority to request that the governor declare that a tourism emergency exists. Authorizes the tourism authority to implement emergency measures to respond to an emergency. Establishes the Hawaii tourism emergency trust fund. (SD1)
