## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- The legislature finds that hunting tourism in 1 SECTION 1. general and private and commercial shooting preserves in 2 3 particular are viable yet underdeveloped. The legislature further finds that promoting hunting tourism permits 4 5 diversification of Hawaii's agricultural resources, creates multi-use habitats, protects native species, boosts local 6 7 economies, and curbs the poaching of game animals. The purpose of this Act is to encourage the development of 8 hunting tourism and particularly private and commercial shooting 9 10 preserves. 11 SECTION 2. Section 183D-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 13 "(b) The hunting license fee shall be: 14
  - (1)\$10 for any person who has resided in the State for one year or longer, or who is a member of the armed forces of the United States on active duty and the spouse and children thereof, or who elects to forgo
