#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In 2000, Congress found that over seven hundred
- 2 lives are lost every day to sudden cardiac arrest in the United
- 3 States. Most cardiac arrests are caused by abnormal heart
- 4 rhythms called ventricular fibrillation. Ventricular
- 5 fibrillation occurs when the heart's electrical system
- 6 malfunctions, causing a chaotic rhythm that prevents the heart
- 7 from pumping oxygen to the victim's brain and body. Once a
- 8 victim suffers a cardiac arrest, every minute that passes before
- 9 returning the heart to a normal rhythm decreases the chance of
- 10 survival. Two out of every three sudden cardiac deaths occur
- 11 before a victim can reach a hospital.
- 12 Congress further found that with current medical
- 13 technology, up to thirty per cent of cardiac arrest victims
- 14 could be saved if victims had access to immediate medical
- 15 response, including defibrillation and cardiopulmonary
- 16 resuscitation. Automatic external defibrillator devices have
- 17 been demonstrated to be safe and effective, even when used by



- 1 lay people, since the devices are designed not to allow a user
- 2 to administer a shock until after the device has analyzed a
- 3 victim's heart rhythm and determined that an electric shock is
- 4 required. The federal "Cardiac Arrest Survival Act" was enacted
- 5 in 2000 to increase public awareness regarding automatic
- 6 external defibrillator devices and encourage their use in
- 7 federal buildings. Subsequent federal legislation provided
- 8 funds for the purchase and placement of automated external
- 9 defibrillators in public places, and encouraged private
- 10 companies to purchase automatic external defibrillators and
- 11 train employees in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and emergency
- 12 defibrillation.
- 13 The legislature finds that the overall congressional
- 14 findings are applicable to Hawaii. The purpose of this Act is
- 15 to increase the availability and use of automatic external
- 16 defibrillators.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 "PART . AUTOMATIC EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS
- 21 §321-A Definitions. As used in this part:



1	"Aut	omatic external defibrillator" means a medical device
2	heart mon	itor and defibrillator that:
3	(1)	Is cleared for market by the Federal Food and Drug
4		Administration;
5	(2)	Recognizes the presence or absence of ventricular
6		fibrillation or rapid ventricular tachycardia;
7	(3)	Determines, without intervention by an operator,
8		whether defibrillation should be performed;
9	(4)	On determining that defibrillation should be
10		performed, automatically charges; and
11	(5)	Requires operator intervention to deliver the
12		electrical impulse or automatically continues with
13		delivery of electrical impulse.
14	"Def	ibrillation" means administering an electrical impulse
15	to an individual in order to stop ventricular fibrillation or	
16	rapid ventricular tachycardia.	
17	"Department" means the department of health.	
18	"Emp	loyee" means a person who performs a service for wages
19	or other	remuneration under a contract for hire, written or
20	oral, express or implied.	
21	"Emp	loyer" means a person who employs one or more
22	employees.	

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         "Employment" means any service performed by a person for
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    another person under any contract for hire, written or oral,
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    express or implied.
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         "Health care facility" includes any program, institution,
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    place, building, or agency, or portion thereof, private or
    public, whether organized for profit or not, that is used,
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    operated, or designed to provide medical diagnosis, treatment,
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    or rehabilitative or preventive care to any person. The term
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    includes health care facilities that are commonly referred to as
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    hospitals, outpatient clinics, organized ambulatory health care
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    facilities, emergency care facilities and centers, health
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    maintenance organizations, or others providing similarly
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    organized services regardless of nomenclature.
         "Health care provider" means any person who is licensed,
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    certified, or otherwise authorized or permitted by law to
    administer health care in the practice of a profession or the
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    ordinary course of business.
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         "Physical fitness facility" means an indoor facility,
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    public or private, including a swimming pool, stadium, athletic
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    field, track, tennis court, basketball court, or volleyball
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    court, that:
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1	(1)	Is supervised by one or more persons, other than	
2		maintenance or security personnel, employed to provide	
3		supervision, instruction, training, or assistance to	
4		persons using the facility; or	
5	(2)	Provides services or facilities focusing primarily on	
6		cardiovascular exertion.	
7	"Place of employment" means any place where employment is		
8	carried on.		
9	"Tra	ined automatic external defibrillator user" means a	
10	person who successfully completes a training course that		
11	includes	cardiopulmonary resuscitation and verifies proficiency	
12	in the us	e of an automatic external defibrillator, or who is	
13	licensed	to practice medicine under chapter 453 or 460.	
14	§321	-B Automatic external defibrillator program. (a) The	
15	departmen	t shall develop standards for automatic external	
16	defibrill	ator instructors and automatic external defibrillator	
17	training	courses in accordance with nationally recognized	
18	guideline	S.	
19	(d)	The department shall identify or develop an	

appropriate curriculum designed for a trained automatic external

defibrillator user who is a member of the general public, and a

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- 1 training curriculum designed for a trained automatic external
- 2 defibrillator user who is a health care provider.
- 3 (c) The department shall make educational materials
- 4 available to the public about the availability and benefit of
- 5 programs that train individuals as automatic external
- 6 defibrillator users. The materials shall include information
- 7 about any exemption from liability for an individual who renders
- 8 defibrillation, and shall encourage members of the public to
- 9 become trained automatic external defibrillator users.
- 10 §321-C Physical fitness facility. A physical fitness
- 11 facility shall have at least one automatic external
- 12 defibrillator on the premises and shall ensure that there is at
- 13 least one trained automatic external defibrillator user on
- 14 staff.
- 15 §321-D Place of employment. Any employer who has one
- 16 hundred or more employees in the employer's employment at any
- 17 one place of employment shall have at least one automatic
- 18 external defibrillator at that place of employment.
- 19 §321-E Residential buildings. Any residential building or
- 20 portion thereof in which space is let by the owner or operator
- 21 to one hundred or more unrelated persons shall have at least one
- 22 automatic external defibrillator on the premises.



1	§321-F State buildings; new or renovated. (a) The state
2	capitol and each state operated airport facility in the State
3	shall have at least one automatic external defibrillator on the
4	premises.
5	(b) All state buildings and any state building that is
6	constructed after December 31, 2007, or that undergoes a major
7	renovation at a cost of \$250,000 or more shall have at least one
8	automatic external defibrillator on the premises.
9	§321-G Maintenance and oversight. (a) Any person who
10	acquires an automatic external defibrillator pursuant to this
11	part shall take reasonable measures to ensure that the automatic
12	external defibrillator is:
13	(1) Used by a trained automatic external defibrillator
14	user;
15	(2) Maintained and tested according to the manufacturer's
16	guidelines; and
17	(3) Readily accessible for use.
18	(b) Any person in possession of an automatic external
19	defibrillator shall register with the local emergency medical
20	service the existence, location, and type of the automatic

external defibrillator unless it was acquired for use in a

private residence or a health care facility.

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(c) Any person who renders out-of-hospital emergency care
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    or treatment to a person by using an automatic external
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    defibrillator shall activate the emergency medical service
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    system as soon as possible and report any clinical use of the
    automatic external defibrillator.
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         §321-H Rules. The department shall adopt rules pursuant
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    to chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of this part.
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         §321-I Penalty. Violation of this part shall be a fine of
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         SECTION 3. Section 453-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
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         "(b) Nothing herein shall:
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              Apply to so-called Christian Scientists so long as
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              they merely practice the religious tenets of their
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              church without pretending a knowledge of medicine or
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              surgery;
              Prohibit service in the case of emergency or the
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              domestic administration of family remedies;
              Apply to any commissioned medical officer in the

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              United States armed forces or public health service
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              engaged in the discharge of one's official duty, nor
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              to any practitioner of medicine and surgery from
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1		another state when in actual consultation, including
2		but not limited to, in-person, mail, electronic,
3		telephonic, fiber-optic, or other telemedicine
4		consultation with a licensed physician of this State,
5		if the physician from another state at the time of
6		such consultation is licensed to practice in the state
7		in which the physician resides; provided that:
8		(A) The physician from another state shall not open
9		an office, or appoint a place to meet patients,
10		or receive calls within the limits of the State;
11		and
12		(B) The licensed physician of this State retains
13		control and remains responsible for the provision
14		of care for the patient; and
15		provided further that the laws and regulations
16		relating to contagious diseases are not violated;
17	(4)	Prohibit services rendered by any person certified
18		under part II of this chapter to provide emergency
19		medical services, or any physician assistant, when the
20		services are rendered under the direction and control
21		of a physician licensed in this State except for final
22		refraction resulting in a prescription for spectacles,

1		contact lenses, or visual training as performed by an
2		oculist or optometrist duly licensed by the State.
3		The direction and control shall not be construed in
4		every case to require the personal presence of the
5		supervising and controlling physician. Any physician
6		who employs or directs a person certified under part
7		II of this chapter to provide emergency medical
8		services, or physician assistant, shall retain full
9		professional and personal responsibility for any act
10		which constitutes the practice of medicine when
11		performed by such person or physician assistant; or
12	(5)	Prohibit automatic external defibrillation by:
13		(A) Any first responder personnel certified by the
14		department of health to provide automatic
15		external defibrillation when it is rendered under
16		the medical oversight of a physician licensed in
17		this State; [ <del>or</del> ]
18		(B) Any person who successfully completes training
19		under an automatic external defibrillator program

[administered by a physician]. An "automatic

external defibrillator program" means [an

appropriate] a training course that includes

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1		cardiopulmonary resuscitation and verifies			
2		proficiency in the use of an automatic external			
3		defibrillator[+]; or			
4	<u>(C)</u>	An individual attempting in good faith, without			
5		remuneration or expectation of remuneration, to			
6		resuscitate a person by administering any			
7		automatic external defibrillator."			
8	SECTION 4	. Section 663-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
9	amended by ame	nding subsection (e) to read as follows:			
10	"(e) [ <del>An</del>	y person who successfully completes training under			
11	any automatic	external defibrillator program administered by a			
12	<del>physician</del> ] <u>An</u>	individual shall not be liable for any civil			
13	damages result	ing from any act or omission while attempting in			
14	good faith, without remuneration or expectation of remuneration,				
15	to resuscitate	a person in immediate danger of loss of life, or			
16	reasonably believed by the individual to be in immediate danger				
17	of loss of life, when administering any automatic external				
18	defibrillator,	regardless of where the automatic external			
19	defibrillator	that is used is located, except as may result from			
20	the person's g	ross negligence or wanton acts or omissions.			
21	Any person	n, including an employer, who establishes an			
22	automatic exte	rnal defibrillator program shall not be liable for			

- 1 any civil damages resulting from any act or omission of the
- 2 [persons or employees] individuals trained under the program
- 3 who, in good faith and without remuneration or the expectation
- 4 of remuneration, attempt to resuscitate a person in immediate
- 5 danger of loss of life, or reasonably believed by the individual
- 6 to be in immediate danger of loss of life, by administering an
- 7 automatic external defibrillator."
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 10 begun, before its effective date.
- 11 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 12 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 13 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 14 the new sections in this Act.
- 15 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2008.

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#### Report Title:

Health; Automatic External Defibrillator

#### Description:

Requires certain places of employment, physical fitness facilities, and buildings, to be equipped with an automatic external defibrillator. Expands the "Good Samaritan" exemption from liability as it applies to users of automatic external defibrillators.
