## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Legislature finds that the use of and
- 2 addiction to methamphetamine, known as "ice", and other
- 3 controlled substances has reached epidemic proportions and is
- 4 considered a serious public health crisis. Enhanced criminal
- 5 penalties are necessary to protect Hawaii's citizens and
- 6 visitors from the dangerous effects of this epidemic.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to make promoting a controlled
- 8 substance in, on, or near a county, state, or federal historic
- 9 property a penal offense.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "§712- Promoting a controlled substance in, on, or near
- 14 county, state, or federal historic property. (1) A person
- 15 commits the offense of promoting a controlled substance in, on,
- 16 or near county, state, or federal historic property if the
- 17 person knowingly:



1	<u>(a)</u>	Distributes or possesses with intent to distribute a
2		controlled substance in any amount in or on the real
3		property comprising a county, state, or federal
4		historic property;
5	<u>(b)</u>	Distributes or possesses with intent to distribute a
6		controlled substance in any amount within seven
7		hundred fifty feet of the real property comprising a
8		county, state, or federal historic property; or
9	<u>(c)</u>	Manufactures methamphetamine or any of its salts,
10		isomers, and salts of isomers, within seven hundred
11		fifty feet of the real property comprising a county,
12		state, or federal historic property.
13	(2)	A person who violates subsection (1)(a) or (b) is
14	guilty of	a class C felony. A person who violates subsection
15	(1)(c) is	guilty of a class A felony.
16	(3)	Any person with prior conviction or convictions under
17	subsection	n (1)(a) or (b) is punishable by a term of imprisonment
18	of not lea	ss than two years and not more than ten years.
19	(4)	Any individual convicted under subsection (3) of this
20	section s	hall not be eligible for parole until the individual
21	has serve	d the minimum sentence required by the subsection."
