A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PALLIATIVE CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that medical caregivers
- 2 for the terminally ill are inadequately protected from
- 3 manslaughter charges when a patient under their care dies.
- 4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to protect from a
- 5 manslaughter charge those medical caregivers who, acting in
- 6 their professional capacity, lose a patient receiving palliative
- 7 care.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 707-702, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "\$707-702 Manslaughter. (1) A person commits the offense
- 11 of manslaughter if:
- 12 (a) The person recklessly causes the death of another
- person; or
- 14 (b) The person intentionally causes another person to
- 15 commit suicide.
- 16 (2) In a prosecution for murder or attempted murder in the
- 17 first and second degrees it is an affirmative defense, which
