A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii must
- 2 diversify its economic base beyond reliance to tourism. A
- 3 revived state agriculture industry holds a promise of not only
- 4 diversifying Hawaii's economy, but also improving the food
- 5 security of our isolated islands and preserving the green space
- 6 and lifestyle that Hawaii's citizens and visitors value.
- 7 Hawaii's agriculture and value-added products contribute
- 8 \$2,400,000,000 to the State's economy and employs more than
- 9 thirty-eight thousand people. During the past twenty years,
- 10 diversified agriculture in Hawaii has more than doubled. The
- 11 prime agricultural lands released from sugar and pineapple
- 12 production present a rare window of opportunity to further
- 13 agricultural development and address the food security needs of
- 14 the State.
- 15 The legislature further finds that in order for Hawaii's
- 16 agriculture to take advantage of this opportunity, it must
- 17 produce safe, high-quality, and market-driven products that

- 1 offset Hawaii's high costs of land, labor, water, and
- 2 transportation. Hawaii's food and agricultural producers and
- 3 processors must produce foods that are safe and nutritious by
- 4 following established Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and
- 5 being GAP certified. There is also a need for assistance in
- 6 developing value-added processed foods that would assist
- 7 entrepreneurs to develop new products that use Hawaii grown
- 8 produce. There is a need for a local facility to provide
- 9 assistance for sensory evaluations of foods as well as
- 10 appropriate packaging and marketing advice. Thus, a food
- 11 innovation and security center is necessary to help address the
- 12 food safety and security needs of Hawaii.
- 13 The University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture
- 14 and human resources is engaged in several areas of research and
- 15 outreach that have already contributed to the resurgence of
- 16 agriculture in Hawaii. The college's contributions to the
- 17 State's agricultural industry include:
- 18 (1) Identification and development of high-value food,
- 19 plant, and fiber products to help Hawaii stay
- 20 competitive in a global market; and

Creation of an agribusiness incubator that helps start 1 (2) 2 agribusinesses and assists existing agribusinesses to 3 expand. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the 4 University of Hawaii to enable the college of tropical 5 agriculture and human resources to develop a long range plan for 6 a food innovation and security center for the development and 7 promotion of new, safe, high-quality, high-value agricultural 8 products. 9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$300,000, or so much 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the 12 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 13 2008-2009, for the college of tropical agriculture and human 14 resources to develop a long range plan for a food innovation and 15 16 security center. 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007. 19
