BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The purpose of this Act is to determine the 2 feasibility of transferring all state highway functions to the 3 counties, including making each county responsible for the 4 highways that are located in that county, and transferring 5 funding for state highways to the counties. 6 SECTION 2.
