A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A LIMITED LOTTERY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes the need to develop 2 a stream of revenue to help fund the repair and maintenance of the State's public schools, as well as to help fund and support 3 programs relating to mental health and substance abuse. 4 5 The purpose of this Act is to provide additional moneys for public purposes by creating a limited lottery. 6 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 7 adding a new chapter in Title 13 to be appropriately designated 8 and to read as follows: 9 "CHAPTER

- 11 STATE LIMITED LOTTERY
- 12 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 13 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 14 "Commission" means the five-member body, appointed by the governor, to oversee the state limited lottery, to be placed 15 within the department. 16

- 1 "Commissioner" means one of the members of the lottery
- 2 commission as appointed by the governor.
- 3 "Department" means the department of business, economic
- 4 development, and tourism.
- 5 "Director" means the director of the state limited lottery.
- 6 "Lottery" or "limited lottery" means the state limited
- 7 lottery established and operated under this chapter.
- 8 "Lottery game" means any procedure authorized under this
- 9 chapter whereby a monetary prize is awarded among persons who
- 10 have paid for tickets that provide the opportunity to win such a
- 11 monetary prize.
- "Lottery retailer" means a person with whom the State has
- 13 contracted for the purpose of selling tickets in lottery games
- 14 to the public.
- 15 § -2 Lottery commission; establishment. There is
- 16 established a commission within the department to oversee the
- 17 lottery. The commission shall consist of five members appointed
- 18 by the governor subject to section 26-34. A majority of members
- 19 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 20 § -3 Rules and procedures. (a) The commission shall
- 21 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to implement this chapter and

1	to govern	the procedures relating to the lottery. The rules
2	shall inc	lude but not be limited to:
3	(1)	Prohibiting the sale of lottery tickets to persons
4		under the age of eighteen;
5	(2)	Prohibiting the participation of any person under the
6		age of eighteen years in any lottery game;
7	(3)	Establishing the lottery ticket price to be \$1 per
8		ticket; and
9	(4)	Limiting the sale of lottery tickets to the amount of
10		one hundred tickets per person per lottery game;
11	(b)	The commission shall establish procedures for the
12	general o	peration of the lottery, including but not limited to:
13	(1)	The time length of each lottery game; provided that
14		the minimum length shall be three months;
15	(2)	The procedure necessary to enforce the maximum amount
16		of tickets that may be purchased per person per
17		lottery game;
18	(3)	The procedure for the procurement of lottery
19		retailers; provided that the procedure shall comply
20		with all state procurement laws;
21	(4)	Establishing the type of lottery game that shall
		constitute the lottery;



1	(5)	The procedure for which lottery tickets shall be sold
2		by lottery retailers;
3	(6)	The procedure for the determination of the winning
4		lottery ticket; and
5	(7)	The procedure for the payment of prizes.
6	(c)	The commission shall have oversight over the lottery
7	office an	d its director.
8	5	-4 Limited lottery office; established; duties. (a)
9	There sha	ll be established a lottery office, within the
10	departmen	t.
11	(b)	The director shall be appointed by the governor under
12	section 2	6-34. The director shall:
13	(1)	Supervise and administer the operation of the lottery
14		program in accordance with this chapter and the rules
15		and procedures adopted by the commission;
16	(2)	Appoint personnel, including deputy and assistant
17		directors, as necessary, to carry out the functions
18		and duties of the director's office;
19	(3)	Confer with the commission on the operation and
20		administration of the lottery; and
21	(4)	Perform all things necessary to carry out this

- 3 § -6 Number and value of prizes. There shall be one
- 4 prize for each lottery game. The prize for each lottery game
- 5 shall be set at \$2,000,000. The lottery retailer who sells the
- 6 winning ticket in a lottery game shall be entitled to payment of
- 7 \$100,000.
- 8 § -7 Lottery to be self-supporting. Except for such
- 9 moneys necessary to fund the start-up of the lottery, the
- 10 lottery shall operate as a self-supporting revenue-raising
- 11 agency of the State and no appropriations, loans, or other
- 12 transfers of state funds shall be made to it.
- 13 § -8 Use of public assistance and electronic benefit
- 14 transfer cards prohibited. The use of electronic benefit
- 15 transfer cards or any other type of public assistance benefit
- 16 for the purchase of lottery tickets is prohibited. As used in
- 17 this section, "public assistance" shall have the same meaning as
- 18 under section 346-1.
- 19 § -9 Unclaimed prizes. Unclaimed prizes shall be
- 20 retained in the state lottery account for the person entitled
- 21 thereto for one hundred eighty day after the prize is won. If
- 22 no claim is made for the prize within this time, the prize shall



- 1 be waived and the prize moneys shall become a part of the state
- 2 general fund.
- 3 § -10 Prohibited acts. (a) A person shall not:
- 4 (1) Alter or forge a lottery ticket;
- 5 (2) Claim a lottery prize by means of fraud, deceit,
- 6 misrepresentation; or
- 7 (3) Conspire, aid, abet, or agree to aid another person or
- 8 to claim a lottery prize by means of fraud, deceit,
- 9 misrepresentation, or in violation of any of the rules
- 10 created by the commission.
- 11 (b) Any person who violates this section shall forfeit any
- 12 winnings received as a result of the violation.
- 13 (c) A violation of this section shall be a class C
- 14 felony."
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 712-1220, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending the definition of "gambling" to read as
- 17 follows:
- 18 "(4) "Gambling". A person engages in gambling if he stakes
- 19 or risks something of value upon the outcome of a contest of
- 20 chance or a future contingent event not under his control or
- 21 influence, upon an agreement or understanding that he or someone
- 22 else will receive something of value in the event of a certain

1	outcome. Gambling does not include a <u>limited lottery under</u>
2	chapter , bona fide business transactions valid under the law
3	of contracts, including but not limited to contracts for the
4	purchase or sale at a future date of securities or commodities,
5	and agreements to compensate for loss caused by the happening of
6	chance, including but not limited to contracts of indemnity or
7	guaranty and life, health, or accident insurance."
8	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for
11	the start-up costs of the lottery.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13	business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
14	this Act.
15	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
