SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO MONITOR RESEARCH THAT IS BEING CONDUCTED TO INVESTIGATE THE RISKS INVOLVED IN THE USE OF BISPHENOL-A AND PHTHALATES IN CONSUMER PRODUCTS, INCLUDING CHILDREN'S TOYS AND CHILDCARE PRODUCTS.

WHEREAS, many common ingredients used for the production of 1 foods, textile, tools, and toys have been found to be toxic for 2 human use or consumption; and 3 4 WHEREAS, phthalates, a class of chemicals used in polyvinyl 5 chloride plastic to improve flexibility and, in cosmetics to 6 bind fragrance to the product, are also used in many products 7 intended for use by infants and young children, including 8 teethers, toys, and soft plastic books; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, there is extensive scientific literature reporting the hormone-disrupting effect of phthalates and substantial 12 evidence that levels of the phthalates of concern are found in 13 humans at levels associated with adverse effects; and 14 15 WHEREAS, often such chemicals have a far greater 16 devastating effect on children whose bodies are still in a 17 18 rapidly developing state in this stage of life; and 19 WHEREAS, population studies show that virtually everyone 20 carries some level of phthalates in their body; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, many have called for a prohibition on the manufacture, sale, or distribution of certain toys and child 24 care articles containing bisphenol-A or specific types of 25 phthalates in concentrations exceeding 0.1 per cent and to 26 require manufacturers to use safer alternatives when replacing 27 phthalates in their products; now, therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 31

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House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Health is requested to monitor research that is being conducted to investigate the risks involved in the use of phthalates and bisphenol-A in consumer products, including children's toys and childcare products; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 8 requested to submit a report to the Legislature no later than 9 twenty days prior to the convening of the 2009 Regular Session 10 on the research being conducted, information gathered, and any 11 recommendations and proposed legislation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and Dean of the University of Hawaii John A. Burns School of Medicine.
