SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP AN ACTION PLAN FOR ADDRESSING INCIDENTS OF PESTICIDE EXPOSURE AT PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

1 WHEREAS, research has shown that the detrimental effects of exposure to chemicals, such as pesticides, can be affected 2 critically by the timing of the exposure, including what stage 3 4 of life a person was in when the exposure occurred; and 5 WHEREAS, as children are still developing, their bodies are 6 7 particularly susceptible to pesticide exposure; moreover, as children's bodies have a higher surface to volume ratio than 8 9 adults, proportionately, pesticide exposure may affect them 10 more; and 11 WHEREAS, the commercial application of pesticides has been 12 suspected in many incidents of students and teachers becoming 13 ill while on a school campus, including incidents occurring at 14 Waimea Canyon School, Kauai, in November 2006 and January 2007; 15 Kahuku High School, Oahu, in May 2007; and St. Joseph Elementary 16 School, Oahu, in March 2008; and 17 18 WHEREAS, on January 25, 2008, due to a noxious odor, ten 19 students and one teacher at Waimea Canyon School were sent to 20 the emergency room with symptoms of headaches, nausea, and 21 dizziness; and 22 23 WHEREAS, although the source of the odor has not been 24 ascertained, the primary suspect is Syngenta Seeds, 25 Incorporated, and its spraying of pesticides on lands it 26 cultivates for farming that are adjacent to the school; and 27 28 WHEREAS, after the January 25th incident, the Kauai 29 representative of the Hawaii State Teacher's Association 30 requested the Department of Health (DOH) to test the students 31 and teachers for toxic levels of pesticides and was told in 32

reply that it is not the Department's practice to conduct 1 2 testing; and 3 4 WHEREAS, members of the Oahu Retired Teachers Association 5 and the Hawaii State Teacher's Association have voiced concern regarding pesticide spraying in proximity to, and on, school 6 7 campuses; now, therefore, 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 9 10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 11 Agriculture is requested to establish a working group to develop 12 an action plan for addressing pesticide exposure at public 13 schools and a monitoring program for schools that may be or may 14 have been affected adversely from pesticide exposure; and 15 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group shall 18 comprise: 19 The advisory committee on pesticides, as established (1) 20 pursuant to section 149A-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 21 and 22 23 24 (2) Two representatives of the Department of Education, including a school administrator and a teacher from 25 school districts that contain schools located in close 26 proximity to areas where the commercial application of 27 pesticides has or is likely to occur; and 28 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group on pesticide use in proximity to schools is requested to investigate and 31 32 issue findings, including but not limited to the conditions and requirements under which commercial application of pesticides 33 may resume following an incident of pesticide exposure at a 34 public school; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 38 Board of Agriculture, the Chairperson of the Board of Education, 39 the Superintendent of Education, the Director of Health, members 40
