SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A FINANCIAL AND MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF HAWAII'S PUBLIC, GOVERNMENTAL, AND EDUCATIONAL ACCESS ORGANIZATIONS.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's four public, educational, and 1 2 governmental access organizations, Olelo Community Television; Akaku: Maui Community Television; Ho'ike: Kauai Community 3 Television; and Na Leo o Hawaii provide equipment and 4 infrastructure for public, educational, and governmental access 5 6 in all four counties; and 7 WHEREAS, these four organizations are charged with the 8 mission of providing nondiscriminatory access to facilities and 9 channels while serving the public, education, and government 10

11 segments equitably; and
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WHEREAS, the input from the public on its needs, however, has been virtually ignored, while the educational and governmental entities' requests have been fulfilled and continue to be the major focus of the access organizations; and 17

18 WHEREAS, it has been alleged that access organizations have 19 been spending an inordinate amount of funds on in-house 20 productions, which have preempted scheduling from certified 21 clients who pay out-of-pocket, turning the face of public, 22 education, and government access toward the corporate world and 23 away from underserved segments of the public; and 24

25 WHEREAS, allegations of wrongdoing have arisen in regard to the Department of Commerce and Consumers Affairs, which 26 regulates the access organizations, including possible partisan 27 28 preferential treatment of candidates for recent state and federal elections, allegations of malfeasance by the Department 29 of Commerce and Consumer Affairs personnel, and forcing the 30 access corporations to change their bylaws to give majority 31 board appointment power to the Director of Commerce and Consumer 32 Affairs; and 33



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1 WHEREAS, allegations have also arisen against the access 2 organizations themselves, including accusations that there has 3 been interference with nondiscriminatory access to facilities 4 and channels, closing meetings to the public, and an emphasis on 5 the access organizations creating their own content rather than 6 facilitating the public in creating their own content; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, now that there is only one statewide cable monopoly, there is concern that self-dealing can and will arise 10 11 between the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, the access organizations boards, the majority of which are appointed 12 by the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and the 13 minority of which are appointed by the cable company; and 14 15 WHEREAS, these organizations, while ostensibly private, are 16 so closely connected with the State that the Office of 17 Information Practices issued an opinion in 2003 involving two of 18 these organizations, stating that they should be considered 19 20 agencies of the State for the purposes of having to comply with chapter 92F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Uniform Information 21 22 Practices Act; and 23 WHEREAS, the Office of Information Practice's 2003 opinion 24 25 would also apply to these two other access organizations; and 26 WHEREAS, since 2003, no other opinion has been issued to 27 the contrary, therefore, as these access organizations are state 28 agencies for the purposes of the Uniform Information Practices 29 Act, so too are they state agencies for the purpose of financial 30 and management audits; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, the public is charged and pays a fee to these access organizations through their cable bills; now, therefore, 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 36 37 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor is 38 39 requested to perform financial and managerial audits of Hawaii's four public, educational, and governmental access organizations; 40 and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor submit the findings 43 and recommendations of the audits to the Legislature not later 44



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than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2009 Regular 1 Session; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor, the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and the executive 6 directors of: Olelo Community Television, Akaku: Maui 7 Community Television, Ho'ike: Kauai Community Television, and Na 8 Too o Hoursti 9
