SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RENAMING THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY AS THE GEORGE R. ARIYOSHI NATURAL ENERGY LAB.

WHEREAS, former Governor George R. Ariyoshi was a visionary 1 who served three terms, from 1974 to 1986, as the first governor 2 of Japanese-American ancestry in the United States; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, being the first governor of Japanese-American ancestry proved to be among one of many firsts he achieved 6 during his three terms in office, as he brought new ideas and 7 innovative policies to his administration; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Governor Ariyoshi emphasized and created long-term plans to secure Hawaii's future, and to preserve the state's 11 fragile environment by recognizing the potential of our natural 12 resources to provide renewable sources of power; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Governor Ariyoshi proposed various ideas to protect the islands, including the idea of "controlled growth" 16 to limit the impact of the growing population within the 17 18 islands; the State Plan, which included measures to conserve the environment; and investment in alternative and renewable sources 19 20 of power, including the development of ocean technologies; and 21 WHEREAS, Governor Ariyoshi's vision was instrumental in 22 developing the Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii (NELH), which 23 24 was created by the Legislature in 1974 to research ocean thermal energy conversion (OTEC); and 25 26 WHEREAS, Governor Ariyoshi's involvement in establishing 27 the Mini-OTEC was essential to its success, as it became the 28 first example of an ocean thermal energy conversion electric 29 power plant in the world; and 30 WHEREAS, in 1986, the Hawaii Ocean Science and Technology 31 (HOST) Park was created under the High Technology Development 32

Corporation as a separate entity, and in 1990, NELH and HOST 1 Park were merged into the Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii 2 Authority (NELHA) and attached to the Department of Business, 3 Economic Development, and Tourism; and 4 5 WHEREAS, HOST Park was the first to successfully install a 6 7 commercial 40 inch diameter, deep-water pipeline to pump water from below 2,200 foot depths up to the surface; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Governor Ariyoshi recognized that these ecologically-friendly techniques could benefit businesses and 11 boost the economy, and was able to develop a master plan and 12 attain a master lease to help reduce bureaucratic red tape for 13 potential businesses; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, cold, nutrient-rich seawater is being used for several purposes, including the production of power, air-17 conditioning, and for growing marine plants and animals, 18 including abalone, oysters, finfish, shrimp, pearls, vegetables, 19 and even flowers; and 20 21 WHEREAS, this facility is now drawing international 22 interest and many countries want to emulate this technology; and 23 24 WHEREAS, through these and other assets, NELHA has 25 attracted tenants who can use its unique complement of natural 26 27 and logistical resources to engage in successful, productive research and commercial activities that support sustainable 28 industry development in Hawaii and provide advanced technology 29 30 jobs for the local economy; and 31 WHEREAS, NELHA could not have been as successful without 32 the early, visionary encouragement and support of Governor 33 Ariyoshi, whose vision for NELHA has become synonymous with the 34 current vision for a sustainable future for Hawaii; now, 35 therefore, 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 38 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 39 House of Representatives concurring, that the Natural Energy 40 41 Laboratory of Hawaii Authority be renamed the "George R. Ariyoshi Natural Energy Laboratory" in honor of former Governor 42 Ariyoshi; and 43
