SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTIES TO AMEND THEIR LAND USE ORDINANCES TO PERMIT VOLUNTARY ROOFTOP LANDSCAPING AND AGRICULTURE IN URBAN DISTRICTS.

1 WHEREAS, in certain areas of the State the amount of usable 2 agricultural zoned lands is vanishing due to increased urban 3 sprawl; and 4 5 WHEREAS, examples of rooftop landscaping already exist in 6 Honolulu, including the Hawaii State Capitol Building and the 7 Kalanaimoku Building, where the roof over a large area of the 8 parking garage is covered with open fields of grass, flowers, and shrubs; and 9

WHEREAS, scientific testing has shown that rooftop landscaping helps to reduce the amount of pollutants and dust particles in the air and water; and l4

WHEREAS, vegetation on city rooftops helps to reduce what is known as the heat island effect by blocking the sun's rays and conserving energy by keeping buildings cooler, thereby reducing the necessity or workload of cooling systems and providing sound insulation; and

21 WHEREAS, the economy of the State of Hawaii is largely 22 dependent on the visitor industry, the main attraction being the 23 natural beauty of our island state, which should be evident in 24 urban areas as well as forests, parks, and conservation areas; 25 and 26

WHEREAS, extensive positive examples of rooftop landscaping and agriculture can be found throughout Australia, Canada, China, Germany, Japan, Singapore, and Switzerland, and experimental projects are underway in Portland, Oregon; Chicago, Illinois; and New York City, New York; and 32

January 2008, at page 40, states as one of the recommended 2 strategic actions regarding environment and natural resources 3 the need to "conserve agricultural, open space and conservation 4 5 lands and resources, " including encouraging "smart growth" concepts in land use and community planning; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources at the University of Hawaii at Manoa is conducting 9 studies of rooftop landscaping and agriculture, especially 10 involving native species; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the allowance and encouragement for rooftop 14 agriculture - through various means including hydroponic farming -- can also provide sustainable agricultural production of fresh 15 16 vegetables, fruit, herbs, among others; now, therefore, 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 19 House of Representatives concurring, that the counties are urged 20 21 to amend their land use ordinances to permit voluntary rooftop landscaping and agriculture in urban districts; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayors, Council 25 26 Chairs, and planning agency directors of the County of Hawaii, the City and County of Honolulu, the County of Kauai, and the 27 28 County of Maui.
