

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO EVALUATE THE NECESSITY OF MANDATORY HEALTH EDUCATION THAT INCLUDES MEDICALLY ACCURATE SEX EDUCATION IN INTERMEDIATE AND MIDDLE SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, health education, including sex education for 1 fifth graders, is an important part of a student's education in 2 the elementary schools; and 3 4 WHEREAS, one semester of health education is a graduation 5 requirement for students in public high schools and is usually 6 7 offered in the ninth or tenth grades; and 8 WHEREAS, health education in intermediate and middle 9 10 schools, however, is increasingly becoming an elective instead of a mandatory course because schools are placing much greater 11 emphasis on attaining Adequate Yearly Progress under the federal 12 No Child Left Behind Act; and 13 14 WHEREAS, sexual health and responsibility, mental and 15 emotional health, personal health and wellness, and promoting 16 safety and preventing violence and unintentional injury are 17 topics that should be covered under the Hawaii Content and 18 Performance Standards III; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the goal of standards-based school health 21 education is to help adolescents develop the essential skills 22 necessary to adopt and maintain healthy behaviors; and 23 24 WHEREAS, this goal cannot be met if health education is 25 considered an elective course of study; and 26 27 WHEREAS, teen pregnancy, abstinence, birth control, 28 sexually transmitted diseases, HIV/AIDS, and how to deal with 29 peer pressure are topics that are covered under the health 30 standards; and 31 32



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WHEREAS, students need to receive these kinds of 1 information early and have it reinforced during their formative 2 and transitional years, from elementary to intermediate or 3 middle school to high school; now, therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 6 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 7 House of Representatives concurring, that the Board of Education 8 is requested to evaluate the necessity of mandatory health 9 education, which would include medically accurate sex education 10 in the intermediate and middle schools; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education is 13 requested to submit a report on its findings and 14 recommendations, including information on implementation for a 15 mandatory course of study in health education in intermediate 16 and middle schools, to the Legislature no later than twenty days 17 prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2009; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 21 Board of Education and the Superintendent of Education. 22 23 24 25
