SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING HAWAII'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO INTRODUCE AND SUPPORT FEDERAL LEGISLATION TO IMPROVE THE VIABILITY OF HAWAII'S GEOGRAPHICALLY DISADVANTAGED FARMERS AND RANCHERS.

WHEREAS, in Hawaii, there is an exceptional dependence on 1 2 sea and air transportation as a means of distributing agricultural products to destination markets; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, there is inadequate port, harbor, and airport infrastructure for Hawaii's farmers and ranchers to compete in 6 7 local, domestic, and international markets and to meet food safety guidelines; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii suffers from unfavorable maritime freight 10 rates compared to more active trade lanes, especially for 11 westbound cargo in Pacific trade lanes, making it difficult to 12 supply Asian markets and to acquire imports from United States 13 14 mainland sources; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture submitted a report to Congress in November 2003 entitled, Report 17 on Geographically Disadvantaged Farmers and Ranchers, ("Report") 18 19 which examined the transportation disadvantages experienced by farmers and ranchers in noncontiguous states of the United 20 States ("noncontiguous states") and United States territories 21 ("territories") as they relate to the movement of farm products; 22 23 and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Report recognized that agricultural shippers in the noncontiguous states and territories do not have access 26 to adequate transportation infrastructure and equipment 27 necessary to be competitive; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Report also recognized that the strong 30 31 reliance on imports from the United States mainland drives up

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input costs in the noncontiguous states and territories, and 1 leaves them vulnerable to transportation disruptions; and 2 3 WHEREAS, as a result of the geographical disadvantage faced 4 by Hawaii's farmers and ranchers, Hawaii has only two dairies 5 6 and four egg farms left in the State and has lost numerous other 7 agricultural producers; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 10 House of Representatives concurring, that Hawaii's congressional 11 delegation is requested to introduce and support federal 12 legislation that will: 13 14 Improve the competitiveness of Hawaii's farmers and 15 (1)ranchers with regard to transportation in the domestic 16 and international marketplace with the long-term goal 17 of seeking parity between Hawaii's farmers and 18 ranchers and their mainland counterparts; 19 20 Address transportation barriers, including inadequate 21 (2)22 port, harbor, and airport infrastructure, that inhibit 23 the ability of neighbor island farmers and ranchers to transport to Oahu markets, and on a statewide level of 24 25 farmers and ranchers to transport to foreign and domestic markets; and 26 27 Address the costs to transport an agricultural 28 (3) commodity, or inputs used to produce an agricultural 29 30 commodity in a geographically disadvantaged state such as Hawaii; and 31 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of Agriculture is requested to work with its federal counterparts 34 35 to effectuate the purposes of this Concurrent Resolution; and 36



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to members of Hawaii's
congressional delegation, the Secretary of the United States
Department of Agriculture, and the Chairperson of the State
Board of Agriculture.
