SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY TO EXAMINE VARIOUS IMPACTS OF A LONGER SCHOOL DAY ON KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE TWELVE STUDENTS.

WHEREAS, where previous discussions focused on the concept 1 2 of "intelligence" and the relative importance of nature versus nurture, the current debate focuses on "cognitive development" 3 and the respective influences of genes and the environment; and 4 5 WHEREAS, "intelligence" was perceived as static and 6 immutable, while "cognitive development" is viewed as a dynamic 7 and continuous process affected by the environment, and, in 8 particular, by a high-quality education; and 9 10 WHEREAS, although teaching all students at the level of the 11 average student was previously acceptable, the educational 12 system now aims to provide a learning environment in which all 13 children meet and even exceed curriculum standards and reach 14 their full potential as productive citizens; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, more time spent in a quality learning environment increases a student's opportunity for improved learning; and 18 19 WHEREAS, learning is enhanced by a cross-disciplinary 20 environment where art, music, games, and physical activity are 21 all part of the curriculum; now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 24 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 25 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 26 Education is requested to conduct a feasibility study to 27 determine whether an extension of the school day, designed to 28 provide increased academic and sociocultural opportunities for 29 students in kindergarten through grade twelve, is an affordable 30 and sound investment for the State; and 31 32



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department is requested to 1 2 include in the report: 3 Information regarding the average number of classroom 4 (1)hours for a student in Hawaii, in the nation as a 5 whole, and in industrialized nations whose academic 6 performance exceeds that of the United States; 7 8 (2) An examination of the financial cost to districts and 9 10 states that have an extended school day; and 11 (3) Information about the content offerings of extended 12 school day programs; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department is requested to submit a report of findings and recommendations, including 16 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 17 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2009; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 21 Education and the Chairperson of the Board of Education. 22 23 24 25
