## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO ASSIST IN DEVELOPING A MASTER PLAN FOR LONG-TERM CARE FOR LEAHI HOSPITAL.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that virtually all of 1 2 Hawaii's senior citizens want to age at home rather than in a care home or institution, yet many will need a more intensive 3 care giving environment in their later years; and 4 5 6 · WHEREAS, Medicaid long-term care costs for the State have been increasing steadily and financial projections portend 7 significantly greater costs, especially with baby boomers 8 starting to retire; and 9 10 WHEREAS, public policy goals for long-term care are as 11 follows: 12 13 Creating a continuum of care, up to and including the 14 (1) terminal phase of life; 15 16 Coordinating referral and case management through 17 (2) single-entry contact; 18 19 Building a family caregiver support system to 20 (3) encourage care of disabled elderly; 21 22 Expanding the capacity of long-term care service 23 (4) providers; 24 25 Stimulating and coordinating research, education, and (5) 26 training on aging issues; and 27 28 29 (6) Developing a cost-effective service delivery and financial assistance approach for long-term care 30 services; and 31 32 WHEREAS, the Legislature further finds that co-locating key 33 parts of a long-term care system would encourage holistic and 34 integrative thinking, stimulate creativity and pilot programs,


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enhance cost efficiencies, centralize access to services, and 1 focus public attention on aging issues; and 2 3 WHEREAS, Leahi Hospital has begun the process of developing 4 5 a master plan to address the State's long-term care public 6 policy goals; and 7 WHEREAS, opened in 1902, Leahi Hospital is the State's 8 oldest and largest long-term care facility and has had no major 9 construction since 1951; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Leahi Hospital is centrally located in the east 12 Honolulu urban region and has one hundred seventy-nine skilled 13 nursing facility/intermediate care facility beds and eleven 14 tuberculosis beds spread among five buildings on a 6.7 acre 15 campus, which is adjacent to ten acres of state property of 16 which parts are vacant and others contain aging buildings; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, Kapiolani Community College, with its family caregiver training program, is also located next to Leahi  $\mathbf{20}$ Hospital; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the process of developing a master plan for Leahi 23 Hospital will offer an opportunity to create innovative and 24 effective models of long-term care services, including 25 residential care; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 28 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, 29 that the Oahu regional board of the Hawaii Health Systems 30 Corporation is requested to convene a task force to assist in 31 developing a long-term care master plan for Leahi Hospital and 32 33 adjacent state lands, totaling 16.4 acres; and 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 35 consist of seventeen members as follows: 36 37 (1) Five members shall be appointed by the Governor; 38 39 (2) Five members shall be appointed by the President of 40 the Senate; 41 42 (3) Five members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the 43 House of Representatives; 44



34 35 36	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force conduct its business in a collaborative manner and include interested stakeholders who wish to contribute to the master plan; and	
37 38 39	BE IT	FURTHER RESOLVED that the master plan:
40 41 42 43	(1)	Provide guidance for future development of the Leahi campus and other parcels, by improving the hospital's facilities while addressing the State's long-term care goals;
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


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Provide the conceptual framework for Leahi Hospital's role in developing a continuum of care system in Hawaii;
Articulate the principles, goals, and strategies for development;
Update Leahi Hospital's mission and vision;
Recommend an implementation plan in phases, over a ten-year period, and near-term actions, to include a financial feasibility study;
Include the following tax map keys: 3-2-30:1, 3-2-31:1, 3-2-31:15, 3-2-32:1, 3-2-33:1, and 3-2-33:3 in the description of its master plan;
Provide programs that may include:
<ul><li>(A) Long-term care and family caregiver education and training;</li></ul>
(B) Innovative models of residential care;
(C) Long-term care and geriatric services; and
(D) Community-based programs such as adult day care and day health, respite care; assistive technology; University of Hawaii Center on Aging Research and Education programs; and Aging and Disability Resource Center programs;
Include resources to enable Leahi Hospital to become a teaching center on "best practices" in long-term care for service providers and facilities managers throughout the State;
Provide an inventory of lands and facilities;
Identify issues regarding land tenure and identify action steps and make recommendations necessary to implement the master plan;



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(11)Address administration of lands and facilities by an 1 independent authority to be established; and 2 3 Recommend options for governance of lands and 4 (12)5 facilities; and 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to complete the master plan by December 31, 2010, and that the task 8 force is requested to submit preliminary and final reports of 9 findings and recommendations, including any necessary proposed 10 11 legislation, not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2009 and 2010, respectively; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 14 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the President of the 15 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the 16 Administrator of Leahi Hospital, the Chairperson of the regional 17 board in which Leahi Hospital is located, Hawaii Health Systems 18 Corporation, the Chancellor of Kapiolani Community College, the 19 Director of Health, the Director of the Executive Office on 20 Aging, and the President of the University of Hawaii. 21
