## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTIES TO AMEND THEIR LAND USE ORDINANCES TO PERMIT VOLUNTARY ROOFTOP LANDSCAPING AND AGRICULTURE IN URBAN DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS, in certain areas of the State the amount of usable 1 agricultural zoned lands is vanishing due to increased urban 2 sprawl; and 3 4 WHEREAS, examples of rooftop landscaping already exist in 5 Honolulu, including the Hawaii State Capitol Building and the 6 Kalanaimoku Building, where the roof over a large area of the 7 parking garage is covered with open fields of grass, flowers, 8 9 and shrubs; and 10 WHEREAS, scientific testing has shown that rooftop 11 12 landscaping helps to reduce the amount of pollutants and dust particles in the air and water; and 13 14 WHEREAS, vegetation on city rooftops helps to reduce what 15 is known as the heat island effect by blocking the sun's rays 16 17 and conserving energy by keeping buildings cooler, thereby reducing the necessity or workload of cooling systems and 18 providing sound insulation; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the economy of the State of Hawaii is largely 21 dependent on the visitor industry, the main attraction being the 22 natural beauty of our island state, which should be evident in 23 urban areas as well as forests, parks, and conservation areas; 24 anđ 25 26 WHEREAS, extensive positive examples of rooftop landscaping 27 and agriculture can be found throughout Australia, Canada, 28 29 China, Germany, Japan, Singapore, and Switzerland, and experimental projects are underway in Portland, Oregon; Chicago, 30 Illinois; and New York City, New York; and 31 32 WHEREAS, the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Plan published in 33 January 2008, at page 40, states as one of the recommended 34 strategic actions regarding environment and natural resources 35

the need to "conserve agricultural, open space and conservation 1 lands and resources, " including encouraging "smart growth" 2 concepts in land use and community planning; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources at the University of Hawaii at Manoa is conducting 6 7 studies of rooftop landscaping and agriculture, especially involving native species; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the allowance and encouragement for rooftop agriculture - through various means including hydroponic farming 11 -- can also provide sustainable agricultural production of fresh 12 vegetables, fruit, herbs, among others; now, therefore, 13 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, 16 that the counties are urged to amend their land use ordinances 17 to permit voluntary rooftop landscaping and agriculture in urban 18 districts; and 19 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Mayors, Council Chairs, and 22 planning agency directors of the County of Hawaii, the City and 23 County of Honolulu, the County of Kauai, and the County of Maui. 24 25 26 27 OFFERED BY:
