SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII, IN CONSULTATION WITH MEDICAL AND BRAIN INJURY EXPERTS, TO WORK WITH THE ATHLETIC COMMUNITY TO DEVELOP A STATEWIDE CONCUSSION PREVENTION AND AWARENESS PROGRAM FOR YOUNG ATHLETES.

WHEREAS, closed head injuries, also known as concussions, 1 are a serious and growing public health issue for athletes 2 3 involved in contact sports; and 4 5 WHEREAS, mild concussions can be difficult to detect and, along with more serious head injuries, can have long-term 6 7 effects such as memory loss, impairments in attention, and motor 8 deficits; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the culture of playing through pain or "toughing 11 it out" can put athletes at risk, and allowing an athlete to return to play too early after a concussion increases the chance 12 of more serious brain injury; and 13 14 WHEREAS, concussions have a cumulative effect and each 15 concussion makes a person more vulnerable to another concussion; 16 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, when a second concussion follows shortly after an initial one, it can cause rapid brain swelling that can result 20 in coma or even death in rare cases; and 21 22 WHEREAS, recent research reveals that multiple concussions 23 may also lead to clinical depression; and 24 25 WHEREAS, five to eight per cent of athletes in state public 26 27 high school suffer concussions each year; and 28 WHEREAS, at the high school level, football is the riskiest 29 sport when it comes to concussions, followed by girls soccer; 30 and 31 32



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1 WHEREAS, awareness about the prevention, identification, and treatment of concussions is lacking; now, therefore, 2 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, 5 6 that the Department of Education and the University of Hawaii are requested to work with the State's athletic community, in 7 consultation with medical and brain injury experts, to develop a 8 9 statewide concussion prevention and awareness program directed 10 at young athletes; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the goal of such a program would be to educate student athletes, parents, educators, 13 athletic directors, and the general public about the symptoms 14 15 and dangers of concussion and to encourage concussion 16 prevention; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the architects of the program 19 are requested to recommend strategies for program 20 implementation; and 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education, 23 24 the Chairperson of the Board of Education, the President of the University of Hawaii, the President of the Hawaii Medical 25 Association, the Executive Director of the Hawaii High School 26 Athletic Association, and the President of the Brain Injury 27 Association of Hawaii. 28 29 30 31
