| 10 11 12 13 14 | WHEREAS, the Kawainui/Hamakua Marsh complex in Kailua, Oahu is Hawaii's largest remaining natural wetland and an ecological and cultural treasure; and |
| 15 16 17 18 19 20 | WHEREAS, the Kawainui/Hamakua Marsh complex, which encompasses approximately eight hundred thirty acres of land, has been identified by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service as a primary habitat for endemic and endangered native Hawaiian birds such as the 'alaeke'oke'o, 'alae 'ula, ae'o, and koloa maoli; and |

Kawainui Marsh to prevent a shopping mall from being built 1 2 there; and 3 4 WHEREAS, for more than thirty years, community 5 organizations have been instrumental in the Kawainui/Hamakua Marsh complex's designation as a Ramsar Wetland of International 6 Importance by contributing to three consecutive master plans for 7 the marsh and conducting numerous natural and cultural 8 restoration programs, educational tours, and events; and 9 10 WHEREAS, community organizations have also provided other 11 12 cooperative efforts to benefit the Kawainui/Hamakua Marsh complex, such as fundraising and conducting pollution control 13 and prevention efforts; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, Ho'olaulima ia Kawainui is a network of concerned community organizations, government agencies, and individuals 17 cooperating to foster public awareness and understanding of the 18 19 natural, cultural, and scenic resources of the Kawainui/Hamakua Marsh complex to ensure the long-term protection, restoration, 20 and stewardship of the Kawainui/Hamakua Marsh complex and the 21 22 surrounding area; and 23 WHEREAS, since 2003, Ho'olaulima ia Kawainui has been 24 actively advocating to unite county, state, and federal agencies 25 to further the goal of consolidating the ownership of the 26 27 Kawainui/Hamakua Marsh complex under the State; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources is currently responsible for the management and sustainability of 30 this important public resource; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources should regularly consult with Ho'olaulima ia Kawainui to 34 coordinate efforts to protect, preserve, and maintain the 35 natural, cultural, and scenic resources of the Kawainui/Hamakua 36 Marsh complex; now, therefore, 37 38 39 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, 40 that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested 41 to regularly consult with Ho'olaulima ia Kawainui and other 42 concerned community entities to coordinate efforts to protect, 43
