HB 2301, HD1 (HSCR443-08) RELATING TO DENTISTRY.

HLT, CPC

Status

Prohibits interference in the practice of dentistry by an unlicensed person or entity. Prohibits the practice of dentistry in a commercial or mercantile establishment. (HB2301 HD1

RELATING TO DISPENSING OPTICIANS.

HLT, CPC

HB 3109 (HSCR457-08) **Status**

Specifies that a dispensing optician's license is required for the dispensing and fitting, upon written prescription, of non-corrective contact lenses and for the sale of or offer to sell non-corrective contact

lenses.

HB 509, HD2 (HSCR475-08)

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, CPC

Status

Prohibits a towing company from charging the owner of a vehicle targeted for towing if the owner of the vehicle appears on the scene.

(HB509 HD2)

HB 2954 (HSCR85-08) Status

RELATED TO TOWING.

TRN, CPC ·

Allows towing companies to charge overtime fees during certain hours of operations. Requires tow companies operating in a county with a population of 500,000 or more to offer consumer service 24 hours a

day.

HB 2550, HD1 (HSCR604-08) Status

RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES.

EEP, CPC

HSH, CPC

Requires the public utilities commission to ensure that a percentage of the total rated generating capacity produced by eligible customergenerators be reserved for electricity produced by eligible residential or small commercial customer-generators. Allows public utilities commission to define maximum capacity for eligible residential or

small commercial customer-generators. (HB2550 HD1)

HB 2492 (HSCR625-08) <u>Status</u>

RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS.

Requires the inclusion of property restrictions or conditions of use in a

seller's disclosure statement.

CPC HB 2408 RELATING TO MORTGAGE BROKERS.

Revises the law regulating mortgage brokers. Status (Deferred from Wednesday, January 30, 2008 hearing.)

HB 2591 RELATING TO GIFT CERTIFICATES. CPC

Requires retailers to pay out in cash the balance of any gift card worth Status less than \$5, if requested by the consumer.

AGR/WLH, CPC RELATING TO WATER RATES. HB 2810

(HSCR196-08) Establishes a process for just and reasonable water rates for farming

operations with PUC oversight, but excludes the water supplier from Status

CPC RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS. HB 2894

Allows for the restatement of planned community association Status

(Deferred from Wednesday, February 6, 2008 hearing.)

HB 2920 RELATING TO FRAUD PREVENTION. **CPC**

Requires notary public to place seal over a succinct phrase describing Pending Re-Referral Status

> document being notarized and to separately record a description of the document. Authorizes attorney general to adopt rules to prevent

fraudulent use of notarized documents.
