SB 2722, SD1 RELATING TO A FIRE SPRINKLER TAX DEDUCTION. CPH, EDT, WAM

Provides an income tax deduction to residential unit owner occupants (SSCR2045) for qualifying costs of installation of an automatic fire sprinkler system

installed after 12/31/08. (SD1) **Testimony**

SB 2913 RELATING TO TAXATION. TIA, EDT, WAM

Exempts from general excise and use taxes the fuel sold from a (SSCR2025) foreign-trade zone for intrastate air transportation by common carriers.

SB 2932, SD1 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE TAX. ENE, EDT, WAM

Increases the state environmental response tax on petroleum in order to (SSCR2032) increase funding available for energy conservation, alternative energy development, global warming initiatives, and other programs pursuant **Testimony**

to section 128D, HRS. (SD1) **Status**

RELATING TO REFUNDABLE RENEWABLE ENERGY TAX SB 2986, SD1 ENE, EDT, WAM

CREDIT. (SSCR2035)

Allows a taxpayer whose sole source of income is derived from pension benefits or with an adjusted gross income of \$20,000 or less to **Testimony** take a refundable tax credit for the purchase and installation of a Status

renewable energy technology, which includes solar water heating,

photovoltaic, and wind systems. (SD1)

SB 3013, SD1 RELATING TO LOSS MITIGATION. CPH, EDT, WAM

Establishes a wind resistive devices tax credit for the purchase and (SSCR2046) installation of wind resistive devices in a non-condominium residential dwelling. Appropriates funds out of the loss mitigation grant fund to **Testimony** enable the loss mitigation grant program to continue until the tax credit

<u>Status</u> becomes available. (SD1)

TIA, EDT, WAM SB 3149, SD1 RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

WAM

Requires the remittance of general excise tax revenues from liquid fuel (SSCR2026) sales to the state highway fund. Repeals provisions authorizing **Testimony** transfers of revenues deemed excess out of the state highway fund.

SB 3215, SD1 RELATING TO BIODIESEL. ENE/AHW, EDT,

Provides various market stimulation incentives for the development of (SSCR2061) biodiesel, including making state agricultural lands available for

biodiesel fuel crops; establishing a state biodiesel feedstock crop and **Testimony** biodiesel fuel purchasing program; and creating tax exemptions for **Status** biomass crushing facilities and lands used for biodiesel feedstock

crops. (SD1)

SB 3236, SD1 (SSCR2064) Testimony Status

RELATING TO LIFE SCIENCES.

Provides for an income tax credit amounting to fifteen per cent of qualified clinical trials incurred, in any county of Hawaii with a population over 700,000, and twenty per cent in any county with a population of 700,000 or less. Establishes criteria to qualify for the tax credit. Caps credit at \$8,000,000 per clinical trial. (SD1)

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.

Persons wishing to testify should submit testimony in one of the following ways at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Any testimony received after 6:00 PM the day before the hearing will not be distributed to the Committee or available to the public until after the hearing ends. As a result, the Committee will not be able to consider written testimony received after 6:00 PM in its decisions.
