Testimony Establishes special education advisory council in chapter 302A, HRS,

relating to education.

SB 2138 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM

Testimony Appropriates funds for special education and early intervention

services provided by private sector or county programs through a grant

pursuant to chapter 42F, HRS.

SB 2080 RELATING TO TEACHER LICENSURE. EDU, JDL

Testimony Requires the Hawaii teacher standards board to revoke a teacher's

license when the teacher has been convicted of certain sexual offenses

against minors.

SB 2228 RELATING TO SCHOOL COUNSELORS. EDU, WAM

Testimony Provides funds for the department of education to hire more school

counselors for middle and high schools. Appropriation.

SB 2288 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM

Testimony Requires the department of education to establish a dropout prevention

strategy that includes research, planning, programs, grants, and supplementary instruction for students at risk of dropping out.

Appropriates funds.

SB 2476 RELATING TO EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES. EDU, WAM

Testimony

Creates a new section allowing children who are home schooled to

participate in extracurricular activities at the public school they would

otherwise be required to attend.

Appropriates funds to ensure that children whose first language is not

English have the resources they need to succeed in Hawaii's school

system.

public school curriculum, including funding for counselor training, expansion of the peer education program, and the hiring of additional

substance abuse counselors.
