<u>SB 2991</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY RESOURCES. To comprehensively address deficiencies in Hawaii's energy resources coordination statutes. Provide policy guidance needed to provide adequate detail on the nature and relationship of the energy data analyses functions required of the State Energy Resources Coordinator and Energy Program. <u>SB 3001</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY. Clarifies provisions of chapter 269, Part VII, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the administration and use of moneys supporting energy- efficiency and demand-side management programs and services.	ENE, CPH
<u>SB 2624</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII ENERGY POLICY FORUM.	ENE, WAM
<u>Testimony</u>	Makes an appropriation for the continuation of the Hawaii Energy Policy Forum.	
<u>SB 2765</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY.	ENE, WAM
<u>Testimony</u>	Transfers general funds into the energy systems development special fund. Appropriates funds from the energy systems development special fund for the Hawaii natural energy institute.	
<u>SB 2990</u>	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.	ENE, CPH
<u>Testimony</u>	Requires that the renewable portfolio standards of 20 per cent by 2020 be met by classic electricity generation from renewable sources.	



<u>SB 3101</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE DEFINITION OF RENEWABLE ENERGY PRODUCER. Amends the definition of "renewable energy producer" to include growers and producers of organic materials used primarily for the production of biofuels or other fuels, so that they will be eligible for direct leases of public land. <u>SB 2504</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Allows the department of transportation and the counties to identify and permit installation of photovoltaic solar panels along highways, roadways, and streets to generate electricity to power lighting fixtures and provide electricity to nearby residential neighborhoods. Allows the DOT and counties to contract with a utility to install photovoltaic solar panels.	ENE, TIA
<u>SB 2985</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEMS FOR PAY AS YOU SAVE. Expands the successful "Pay As You Save" solar water heater program to photovoltaic systems that convert sunshine into electricity, allowing users to pay each month through their electricity bill.	ENE, CPH

- Anyone submitting testimony on the day of the hearing must make 15 copies (two-hole punched on top and, if more than one page, stapled) of their testimony and deliver to the hearing room before the hearing starts.
