Amends Act 150, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, to provide funding to the High Technology Development Corporation for the planning of a technology park on Oahu and to prepare a science and technology master plan for Hawaii. SB 2824, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1347-08) Status (Email Testimony)	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. To ensure compliance with procurement code, requires State Procurement Office annual random audits of government purchasing agencies and audits of agencies selected based on a pattern of agency noncompliance. Appropriates funds for Auditor to audit State Procurement Office and Executive agencies.	EDB, LMG, FIN
