HB 1993, HD1 (HSCR927-08) Testimony Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds to provide care for uninsured Hawaii residents. Effective 07/01/2020. (HB1993 HD1)	HTH/HSP, WAM
HB 2795, HD1 (HSCR941-08) Testimony Status	RELATING TO MEDICAID. Establishes a timeline by which the department of health shall reconcile managed care supplemental payments; provides a clear definition of what conditions constitute a "change of scope" for purposes of increasing or decreasing rates paid to a federally qualified health center or rural health clinic; specifies a process through which these providers may file for a new rate due to "change of scope;" and identifies services that are required to be reimbursed under the prospective payment system.
