HB 2032 RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Prohibits the employees' retirement system from acquiring securities of

companies that have active business operations with Uganda.

HB 2142 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

INT, EDN, FIN

provinces in the Philippines. Appropriates funds.

HB 2624 RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL LEARNING MISSIONS.
