RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

Clarifies limitations on corporate contributions to a noncandidate committee. Clarifies that retiring elected officials may contribute surplus funds to a political party without filing an organizational statement. Requires campaign spending commission to adopt rules

that establish schedule of fines.

HB 2602

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

JUD

Doubles the amount a candidate can transfer from campaign or surplus funds to a community or charitable organization.

HB 2730

JUD RELATING TO LEGAL REQUIREMENTS FOR NEIGHBORHOOD

BOARD MEETINGS.

Prescribes the procedure to be followed at certain neighborhood board meetings, such as the information that may be included in the written public notice, the information that the board may receive on a matter, and the deliberation and decision-making process.

HB 3013

RELATING TO THE AGREEMENT AMONG THE STATES TO ELECT THE PRESIDENT BY NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE.

Adds a new chapter to Hawaii Revised Statutes to allow member states to determine the winner of a presidential election by "national popular

vote".

HB 2557

RELATING TO EVIDENCE.

Protects the disclosure of sources for journalists and newscasters.

Establishes an exception.

HB 3386

RELATING TO ATTORNEYS.

Changes the procedure for determining representation of state

departments by the attorney general and allows the attorney general to

represent the legislature and judiciary under certain conditions.

HB 3422

RELATING TO SURCHARGE FOR INDIGENT LEGAL

SERVICES.

Increases indigent legal services funding by increasing the surcharge

on initial filing fees for civil actions.

HB 3369

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR LEGAL SERVICES.

JUD, FIN

Appropriates funds to certain legal service providers to help them continue to offer a wide range of essential legal services on civil matters to low-income residents at their current levels of operation, and further develop their capacity to meet the expanding need for legal

services amongst this population.

HB 2729

RELATING TO BURGLARY.

JUD

Creates a new offense of burglary in the first degree involving a

dangerous instrument. Defines "dangerous instrument".

## **DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW**
