SB 2202 (SSCR2625) RELATING TO PARTIAL PUBLIC FINANCING OF ELECTIONS.

JUD, FIN

<u>Status</u>

Qualifies a candidate for the office of prosecuting attorney to qualify for partial public campaign financing if the candidate does not exceed

the respective campaign expenditure limit.

SB 3019, SD1

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

JUD, FIN

(SSCR2641) Status

Amends current provisions of the insurance investment statutes allowing insurers more investment flexibility without significantly lessening protection to insurance policyholders and to reflect more

current regulatory standards. (SD1)

SB 2150, SD2

RELATING TO ADULT PROTECTION.

HSH, JUD, FIN

Status

(HSCR1084-08)

Expands the adult protective services law by extending protections to vulnerable adults. Appropriates funds to the department of human

services. (SB2150 SD2)

SB 3051, SD2, HD1

(HSCR1109-08)

RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR SOCIAL SERVICES PROGRAMS.

HSH, JUD, FIN

Status

Authorizes the Department of Human Services or its designee to

conduct criminal history record checks for those providing services to vulnerable adults and children. Effective 7/1/2050. (SB3051 HD1)

SB 1343, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1085-08)

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

HSH, JUD, FIN

Status

Amends the offenses of assault in the second degree and terroristic threatening in the first degree to include conduct committed against victims who the courts and police are attempting to keep safe with

protective orders. (SB1343 HD1)

SB 2730, SD2 RELATING TO CHILD PROTECTION. HSH, JUD (SSCR2869) Establishes a grandparent, or other appropriate relative, preference for out-of-home placement of children needing child protective services. Status (SD2) SB 2004, SD2 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, JUD, FIN Extends the deadline within which to file a request for a due process (SSCR2806) hearing relating to the education of a child with a disability from 90 Status days to 180 calendar days when the request is for reimbursement of costs of a child's placement. Requires the department to report to the legislature annually on the number of these requests awaiting hearing. (SB2004 SD2) SB 2196, SD2 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES ON OCEAN WLH, JUD, FIN (HSCR1087-08) WATERS. Status Adds regulatory function over commercially permitted use of government and private boating facilities and commercial activities in private marinas. (SB2196 SD2)
