RELATING TO LANGUAGE ACCESS.

LAB, HSH, FIN

Clarifies definitions related to language access. Requires certain entities to file a language access plan and appoint a language access coordinator. Expands the language access advisory council from 11 to

15 members.

HB 2389

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Prohibits claimant attorneys from entering into agreements with claimants to obtain fees that are higher than those approved by the

director of labor and industrial relations.

HB 3290

RELATING TO ASSISTING PERSONS UNDER A COMPACT OF FREE ASSOCIATION.

LAB, INT, FIN

Creates one state coordinator position within the department of labor and industrial relations to assist individuals present in Hawaii under the various Compacts of Free Association; makes appropriation.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
