RELATING TO TAXATION. EDT, WAM SB 2240 Creates a refundable state earned income tax credit for individual **Testimony** taxpayers' which is equal to 20% of the federal earned income tax credit. EDT, WAM RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX. SB 2391 Exempts from the general excise tax, commissions earned by a Testimony manufacturer's representative for the direct purchase of imported tangible personal property from the manufacturer by a customer. RELATING TO INCOME TAX CREDIT. EDT, WAM SB 2495 Provides for a tax credit of \$\\$ for taxable year 2008 pursuant to Testimony article VII, section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
