SB 2124 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU/HTH, WAM

Testimony Requires the department of education, in collaboration with the department of health, to provide accurate information on human

department of health, to provide accurate information on human papillomavirus, the link between human papillomavirus infection and cervical cancer, and the availability of human papillomavirus immunizations to parents of female sixth graders in public schools.

SB 3043 RELATING TO PHYSICAL EDUCATION. EDU/HTH, WAM

Testimony Requires physical education as a mandatory component of the public

school education curriculum.

SB 2701 RELATING TO STUDENT HEALTH. EDU/HTH

Requires each student to have a vision evaluation done by an

ophthalmologist, physician, optometrist, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse 6 months before entering the beginning grade of any school in the State, at parents' cost. Gives

parents right to refuse examination.

<u>SB 2403</u> RELATING TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE. HTH/EDU, WAM

Testimony Appropriates funds for school-based substance abuse programs and for

therapeutic living programs.

SB 2590 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE IN RURAL COMMUNITIES. HTH/EDU, WAM

Testimony Requires all graduates from the University of Hawaii school of

medicine who have completed residency and are licensed to practice medicine to work 2 years in a rural community in the State. Imposes penalty for noncompliance. Requires board of medical examiners to

adopt rules.

RELATING TO THE CANCER RESEARCH SPECIAL FUND. SB 2673 HTH/EDU, WAM Increases the sources of revenue available to support the Cancer **Testimony** Research Center of Hawaii. Allows moneys in cancer research special fund to be used for capital expenditures. SB 2674 RELATING TO NURSING. HTH/EDU, CPH Allows a master's degree candidate in a nursing program who has **Testimony** completed the pre-licensure component of the program to apply for a license by examination to practice as a registered nurse. SB 2729 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SYSTEM. HTH/EDU, WAM Establishes a student loan forgiveness program to provide health care Testimony to underserved areas of the State. RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS. SB 2136 HTH/EDU Requires the Department of Health, in collaboration with the Testimony Department of Agriculture, Department of Education, and Hawaii School Food Service, to develop nutritionally-sound public school menu plans that give students the option of a vegetarian school lunch meal. Burns school of medicine. Report to legislature. EDU ONLY SB 2109 RELATING TO NURSING. EDU, WAM Creates a nursing teacher loan forgiveness pilot program at the **Testimony** University of Hawaii. RELATING TO ESTABLISHING A GLOBAL YOUTH CENTER. SB 2233 EDU, WAM Establishes a global youth center under the University of Hawaii. **Testimony** SB 2897 MAKING APPROPRIATIONS AND AUTHORIZING THE EDU, WAM ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS AND Testimony REVENUE BONDS FOR COCONUT ISLAND IMPROVEMENTS. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds and make an appropriation for improvements to coconut island facilities of the Hawaii institute of marine biology; authorizes the issuance of revenue bonds by the UH for the same purpose. MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF SB 2902 EDU, WAM HAWAII FOR PEACE EDUCATION. Testimony Appropriates funds for the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for Peace at the University of Hawaii for the hiring of a director; administrative, professional, and technical staff; and an assistant professor. Also appropriates funds for research and an international conference. **SB** 3128 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. EDU, WAM Authorizes the transfer of all University funds with the exception of <u>Testimony</u>

general funds, into the University of Hawaii Commercial Enterprise

Revolving Fund.

<u>Testimony</u>	Requires at least 90 per cent of revenues from University of Hawaii post-season athletic appearances to be allocated to the UH athletics
