**Testimony** 

Requires the DOT to expend an unspecified percentage of moneys in the state highway fund annually for maintenance and repair of the state highway system and county roads; to annually determine and repair the ten most critical public highways and the ten most critical public highways in resort destination areas; to determine and adhere to minimum quality standards for materials and construction methods, a formula for pothole repair and maintenance of previous pothole repairs, and a reasonable time period for the use of temporary plates when maintenance and repair require extensive road patching; establishes unspecified penalty for failure to meet requirements.

Requires all school buses purchased or leased for use in Hawaii as of July 1, 2010, to be equipped at all designated seating positions with a combination pelvic and upper torso passenger restraint system; defines "passenger restraint system"; deletes school buses from exemptions for mandatory use of seat belts. SB 2094 Testimony	RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSES.  Permits the examiner of drivers to waive the test of knowledge of the rules of the road for applicants holding a valid driver's license from another state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, a province of the Dominion of Canada, or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. SB 2366 Testimony	RELATING TO STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. Prohibits texting using electronic wireless communication device while driving.	TIA, JDL
