I. Background and Summary

- 1. A BRIEF description of the applicant's background;
 The Molokai Livestock Cooperative (MLC) is a state licensed agriculture cooperative organized under Hawaii Revised Statutes Section 421. The MLC was formed by the Molokai community in 1988 to address the need for an on island slaughter and processing plant. It took 17 years from conception to the actual development of the facility, and in 2006 MLC finally opened to the public. The MLC is certified by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), which authorizes the slaughter and process of cattle, hogs, and exotic animals. Currently, MLC is limited to processing approximately 1000 pounds of beef (three to four whole carcasses) a week for the Molokai grocery stores, restaurants, and its retail customers.
- The goals and objectives related to the request;
 The goal of the MLC is to provide slaughtering and processing services, to increase marketing options and returns to producers, and to supply the Molokai community with fresh, safe, and affordable meat products while monitoring livestock health and diseases. To operate the facility in a cost-effective manner whereby any benefits will be returned to members and to the community.

Currently, MLC is limited due to staffing. MLC's primary objective is to hire, train, and certify personnel, thus having an opportunity to increase production sales. The requested funds will also help to pay the high cost of utility expenses.

3. State the public purpose and need to be served;
MLC provides quality Molokai grass-fed beef to its community. The benefits of having fresh, safe and affordable meat products are significant. Prior to the opening of MLC residents that raised livestock would slaughter and process in their backyards, with the possibility of consuming diseased meat. The Molokai ranchers will have the capability to supply the entire island with natural grass-fed beef, sustaining the cattle industry on Molokai.

All slaughtered and process hogs are used for family luaus, no wholesale or retail sales are available at this time.

Molokai utilities are the highest in the State of Hawaii, some grant funds will be used to supplement MLC operation expenses. MLC can not stay open to serve the public if the utilities are not paid (annual utilities \$30K).

- 4. Describe the target population to be served; and
 The population of Molokai is approximately 8,000 with an influx of 200 or
 more snowbirds (long term winter visitors) in the months of November
 through March. The MLC sales double in revenue during this period. It's
 been observed that the residents will purchase inexpensive meat cuts like:
 ground beef, boneless stew meat, chuck steak, brisket, etc. whereas; the
 visitors would consume expensive prime cuts of beef. MLC targets both
 markets, Ohana Pak for the local resident (it feeds a family of 6 on a budget
 for a week), and also provides for the health conscious that appreciate the
 quality of natural grass-fed prime cut beef.
- 5. Describe the geographic coverage.

 The geographic coverage of Molokai is primarily agriculture. The MLC facility and retail outlet is located near the airport in Hoolehua, prime Hawaiian Homes Agricultural Lands. There are eight major cattle ranches, of which four are located in a seven mile radius and the others, are on each end of the island. The grocery stores and restaurants that purchase MLC processed meats are located throughout Molokai.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

• Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities; The MLC board members (volunteers) are responsible for the overall business; there is a part-time general manager and two full time (includes a plant supervisor) employees. The GM is charged with scheduling the daily functions, market & sales, the financial budget, personnel and clerical. The actual slaughter and processing (butcher) is directed by the plant supervisor. The MLC human resources are controlled by its financial limitations, which determines the amount of production. The maximum wage is \$12 per hour plus medical benefits. The requested funds are necessary to hire, train, and certify employees with the intention of increasing production sales thus making this business enterprise viable and successful. It is essential to increase well trained personnel by two more bodies; the GM should be working full time, all employees should have comprehensive training in Hazard Analysis & Critical Control Point (HACCP) certification. Presently, only the plant supervisor has this certification, it is a mandate to keep the MLC plant open. The certification cost is \$2,500 per person.

- The applicant shall provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

 The primary intention is to hire, train, and certify personnel in the first four months of receiving the funds. The increase in qualified employees will allow MLC to double its production capacity within the annual timeline, this will help to alleviate MLC's financial deficient and operate at cost.

 The greatest problem MLC is experiencing is the lack of funds to hire, train, and certify personnel, this limits MLC's capability to expand production and to operate at cost. Presently, only one MLC employee is certified HACCP, and none of MLC employee has had any formal training in slaughter or processing, just on the job training. They hadn't the chance to observe the larger Hawaii plants in process. The HACCP certification is a valuable instrument, without it, the plant shuts down. To invest in employees, qualifies their skills, provides empowerment and raises morale. Well performed employees evaluation is a vital monitoring tool. The financial outcome will justify the plan.

- Record the increase in the number of slaughter and process production.
- Financial records to substantiate revenue growth.

IV. Experience and Capability

Presently, the MLC employs a general manager, a plant supervisor, and one plant worker.

It is proposed that the current GM be the office administrator, due to her business qualification and one year experience with the company. The GM should be certified and knowledgeable in the actual slaughter and process production of the plant. The GM will actually work, guide, train and oversee the three plant workers. He/She should have office and communication skills to understand the office administrator responsibilities, these competences shall maintain all aspect of the facility and business as a whole. The current plant supervisor has two years of experience and is certified HACCP, the GM position may be a promotion. There is a need to hire and train two additional workers and certifying all.

Molokai is limited regarding officially trained slaughterhouse workers (most locals are familiar with backyard butchery). It take a particular individual (determined through hiring process) to work in a slaughterhouse, once hired he/she will have the opportunity to be a skilled abattoir employee.

B. Facilities

The construction of the MLC facility was completed in 2004; it meets all federal, state, and county building code requirements. The facility is ADA approved with access ability to and in the entire structure, including the public ADA restroom.

V. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

A. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision and Training

The proposed staffing shall be as follows:

The GM should be a full time employee (perhaps supervisor promotion), properly trained and certified in the plant slaughter and processing division, he/she will work directly with three trained and certified plant workers to assure an increase in production.

The office administrator (currently GM's task) will be responsible for scheduling appointments with ranchers and vendors, market & sales, the financial budget, human resource, and records/reports files. This position is and can continue to be a 20 hour week employee.

The actual slaughter and processing manpower would increase by two more employees, having a total for four in the production division of the plant. All new hire will be trained and certified HACCP, increasing production is the major thrust in making this business enterprise viable and successful.

Currently, MLC two plant employees split their weekly task between slaughter days and process days, which limits production. The increase in personnel will allow both plant departments to run simultaneously and more efficiently.

Dear Mr. Nyuha:

The Moloka'i Livestock Cooperative (MLC) submits this "Grant in Aid" request for \$75K. These grant funds will primarily be used to hire, train, and certify personnel, thus having an opportunity to increase production sales and sustain the business. The requested funds will also help to pay the high cost of utility expenses.

MLC's production is limited due to staffing. MLC needs to add two trained and certified employees to meet the criteria of the HACCP mandate. Presently MLC has only one such employee, which places MLC in a precarious position.

Since January 2006, the MLC has been certified by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and has actively functions as a business. It's been two years that MLC has provided slaughtering and processing services to the Moloka'i community, and even though the construction is complete and business shows increasing potential, MLC still needs financial assistance until it earns revenue that is greater than its operational expenses. To date, MLC is not economically sustainable.

Please notice I have included two cover pages, one checked type of grant under **Subsidy Request** and the other under **Operating Request**. I was not sure which category MLC would be eligible.
