Application for Grants and Subsidies

I. Background and Summary

Pacific Islands Athletic Alliance (PIAA) has assisted 100's of Hawaii student athletes secure athletic and academic scholarships and grants, totaling over \$8M since 2003. PIAA has been operating strictly on a volunteer basis since 2003 and through the generosity of private party donations and some advertising. The staff of PIAA has an extensive background in sports and sports marketing and utilizes their knowledge to provide free services to Hawaii athletes and their families at no cost, including scholarship search, financial aid preparation assistance, SAT Workshops, camps as well as clinics for high school coaches and more. PIAA is a Hawaii Domestic Non-Profit; 501(c) 3 is pending. Per IRS we may apply for donations and grants as long as we disclose we are in a pending status.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

To be able to continue to provide services to Hawaii's student athletes and their families free of charge, who may not otherwise afford to go to college without athletic and academic grant monies. With the ever increasing number of students coming to PIAA for assistance, PIAA finds it difficult to financially survive. These services include SAT Workshops, Clinics, Camps, marketing the athlete to colleges, FAFSA (Pell Grant) assistance, information sessions at local high schools for athletes, parents, high school counselors and coaches regarding NCAA eligibility, the realities of the athletic recruiting process, college funding and more.

3. State the public purpose and need to be served;

The sole purpose of PIAA is to increase the number of students in Hawaii to continue their education after high school. Often that is only through athletic grants and scholarships. PIAA provides resources and opportunities to the student athletes who would like to continue their education while having their athletic abilities pay for all or part of their educational expenses.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

Hawaii's high school students. Ideally, 75% of those served should be from low income homes/neighborhoods.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The entire State of Hawaii, all student athletes enrolled in high school from grades 9-12 may take advantage of the PIAA programs.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities;

PIAA provides SAT Workshops (totaling 6 hours each) six (6) times a year open to all students who would like to take the class, it is not exclusive to athletes, with instructor Raymond Karelitz, Hawaii's foremost SAT instructor. On average we have 80-100 students per session. Students and counselors have reported higher SAT scores when a student has taken this test a second time after taking the SAT workshop. Additionally, students often take the class a second time as a refresher prior to taking another Sat. This class instructs the students on how to take the test. They enter the test without the normal nerves, they are prepared, they understand all the test instructions prior to entering, understand what will be in each section of the test. When they go in knowing what to expect, their test scores rise. The measurement of effectiveness is the higher test scores and number of students being accepted into college every year from Hawaii.

PIAA runs an Evaluation Camp (May 2008 will be our 7th year) where college coaches from around the country come to evaluate 250+ local high school football players (current juniors and sophomores). The majority of these athletes can not afford to attend mainland camps. Over 40 major colleges and universities attend, including the University of Hawaii staff. Without this event, many of the local, low and middle income students would never have the opportunity to be seen and their talents evaluated by college coaches. There are many "big time" football camps put on by NIKE, Adidas and private for-profit groups. The PIAA Evaluation Camp is free to all local football players. Coach Rich Miano from University of Hawaii has said it's the 'best run evaluation camp in the country'; Coach Mark Banker from Oregon State said "no one puts together a camp like this, with the information PIAA provides to the college coaches". PIAA provides the college coaches with video on each athlete participating as well as their up to

date transcripts and SAT scores. In 2007 over 28 Hawaii athletes were offered athletic scholarships on the day of the event. Many more were offered as a result of this event, the final number to be determined at the conclusion of the 2008 school year. From the class of 2007, the camp assisted with over 75 boys going on to college the following year.

PIAA runs a Coaches Clinic, averaging over 250 coaches from Hawaii ranging from Pop-Warner level through College, instructed by college coaches from programs nationwide, including but not limited to Hawaii, USC, Notre Dame, UCLA, Arizona, Oklahoma and more. Many of the coaches who come in can command speaking fees for \$5,000 to \$10,000 per event. They come to this event and not only pay their own airfare and lodging, they provide their instruction for free on behalf of the good work PIAA does and the assistance we provide to them during the recruiting process. The Hawaii Athletic Directors and Coaches Association endorses this event to its members

PIAA profiles high school athletes to colleges nationwide, in all sports, on our website and through a recruiting sheet set to colleges (sports specific) at all levels around the country. PIAA provides these services for a one time membership fee of \$35 in order to help offset costs. We provide the college with everything they need to make an informed decision on the Hawaii H.S. Athletes. PIAA annually attends the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) conference on the mainland to promote Hawaii's student-athletes. In January 2008, PIAA distributed over 3,000 DVD's provided by over 100 Hawaii student athletes at no charge to the families. This year the event was sponsored by the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl, Koga Engineering, Mr. Duane Kurisu, Global Consulting, Hawaiian Electric and the Tony Group.

PIAA is regularly invited to local high schools to speak on NCAA rules and regulations, athletic recruiting and financial aid as related to athletes. The result of these meetings is increased knowledge on the part of all involved: the athlete, the parents, coaches and counselors. They all know what their part is in the recruiting process so the athlete can successfully go on to college. PIAA is not a recruiting service. Unlike recruiting services that charge over \$2500, PIAA has permission by the NCAA to speak directly to college coaches and hold events including college coaching staffs. Recruiting services are not approved by the NCAA. They come into high school, give limited information then pitch their services and make parents feel guilty for not helping their children. They prey on low income and uneducated families.

PIAA received national attention in USA Today when in February 2007 more athletes from the State of Hawaii signed National Letters of Intent to play

collegiate sports than ever before. This is a sign of the good work PIAA is doing in Hawaii

PIAA runs on a school year calendar, with the results of our work showing each May/June when students are graduating and preparing to leave for college.

Events are as follows for 2008-2009

June – May, promoting athletes, in-school informational sessions

September & November – SAT Workshops

November 2008 – boys and girls basketball, tennis, volleyball signings

January 2009 – Nashville Tennessee, conference,

American Football Coaches Association

February 2009 – football, soccer, water polo signings

February & March – SAT Workshops

April 2009 – all sports not listed plus late signings for listed sports signings

May 23-24 – PIAA Coaches Convention and PIAA Hawaii H.S. Evaluation Camp

Our results are evident and published regularly in the Star Bulletin and Honolulu Advertiser when students are listed as going to college. PIAA knows all the students personally that are involved with PIAA and the staff is in contact with them on a weekly basis to check results. PIAA is also regularly in contact with the parents and the high school coaches. PIAA is increasing opportunities for athletes by making calls to colleges, sending DVD's to colleges, notifying students of opportunities, providing clinics and camps for college exposure.

Results are improved with the increasing cooperation of the high school counselors and coaches attending the informational sessions. We are building a knowledge base that Hawaii needs so desperately.

PIAA will provide numbers of athletes and local coaches attending all events and from what local schools so the State may see who we are assisting and from where.

PIAA will provide SAT scores to State agency from the students who take the SAT score so State may measure and compare scores to students who may not have taken an SAT workshop thru PIAA or other agency.

PIAA will provide names of schools hosting informational sessions and how many parents and athletes attended the event.

PIAA does not require daily working facilities. PIAA provides workshops at the U of Hawaii or at the local high schools. PIAA Evaluation Camp is run annually at Saint Louis School. PIAA H.S. Coaches Clinic is held annually at the East-West Center. PIAA holds informational sessions at local high schools at the invitation of counselors and/or coaches.

Doris Sullivan, Director, was an Assistant Marketing Director for the Washington Bullets (aka Wizards) of the NBA. She was also a Bank Manager for Bank of America. Her background in sports marketing and finances allows her to assist the athletes in understanding the recruiting process and financial aspects of attending college. Doris was a volunteer for Special Olympics for more than 20 years and a tutor at the University of Maryland while a student there.

Danny Cup Choy, Director of Student Services, a former Kamehameha Schools athlete and graduate of Loyola Marymount University has been donating his time and expertise in video editing. He organizes the SAT Workshops, assists with the H.S. Informational Sessions and verifying and posting athletic information on the

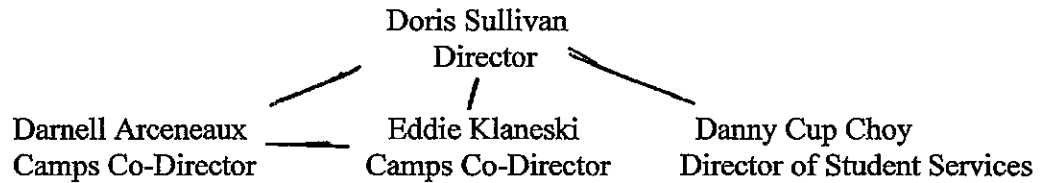
PIAA website. Danny also donates his time to educating young Americans on the importance of their right and duty to vote. Danny would be hired as a full time employee when funds are available.

Darnell Arceneaux and Eddie Klaneski, Co-Directors of Camps, are both former local high school athletes (Saint Louis and Damien respectively) and former collegiate athletes with an excellent understanding of college athletics and the recruiting process. Both are educators in Hawaii High Schools and are volunteers on the PIAA staff.

Even before PIAA became an official organization, the staff ran the combines and clinics for the athletes and coaches. The PIAA Evaluation Camp has become one of the most respected high school football camps in the country.
