# Monday, March 17, 2008

The Senate of the Twenty-Fourth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2008, convened at 11:42 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Yubun Narashiba, Jodo Mission of Hawai'i, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Second Day.

At this time, the following introductions were made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Inouye recognized the efforts that the Hawaii Air and Army National Guard have contributed to three recent natural disasters in Hawai'i—the Kaloko Dam breach on Kaua'i in March 2006, the Big Island earthquakes in October 2006 and the high winds that struck Maui in December 2007. Representing the Hawaii National Guard were Sergeant First Class Alvin Sniffen, Master Sergeant Bernard Wong, Lieutenant Colonel Patrick Fierro, Captain Joe Tolentino, Staff Sergeant Dave Van Buren and Major David Kashiwamura.

Senators Espero and Fukunaga, Trimble and Tokuda commemorated the 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Honouliuli Japanese Internment Camp, and introduced the following internees: Chojira Kagerura, accompanying him was his wife Setsuko, Harry Urata and Jack Tasaka. Accompanying the internees were Donald Amano and Jane Kurahara, co-chairs of the Hawaii Confinement Sites Committee; Betsy Young of the Japanese Cultural Center of Hawai'i; and Stacy Sasegawa of Monsanto Hawaii.

At 12:08 p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
