Senator Slom rose in opposition and stated:

"Madam President, reluctantly I rise to speak against S.C.R. No. 63 and S.R. No. 36, which is the armband campaign against domestic violence.

"I say regrettably because of course I'm opposed to domestic violence and want to support changes to domestic violence. But I told this Body a month-and-a-half ago, I'm no longer going to go on midnight vigils or wear armbands or anything else for women and others who have been killed because of domestic violence. I'm really tired that the Legislature and the government, which has a primary responsibility of protecting its citizens, has done nothing to slow down, stop, or mitigate domestic violence. All we do is have ceremonies.

"And in this resolution I notice, by the way, it only applies to men committing domestic violence on women. And I think there are enough documented cases of women committing domestic violence on men that, at the very least, this resolution should reflect that, that we're against domestic violence.

"Secondly, however, I notice that we have done nothing to prevent or to allow people to have choices—and particularly women—in defending themselves. We've done nothing to allow third party citizens who are good Samaritans to try come to the aid of victims. All we do is celebrate the harm or the death of victims.

"Finally, we had a bill that was introduced earlier in this Session. It was referred to as Karen's Law. It went over to the House, and the House refused to even have a hearing on this bill. So how can we in good conscience say that we're against domestic violence, that we want to do something, when all we want to do is put on an armband. And even this resolution that started out as a black armband, now we're worrying about colors and we want to change it to a purple armband.

"I want us to really attack the problem of domestic violence and end it. Resolutions like this and midnight vigils don't do that. Thank you."

Senators Kim and Gabbard requested their votes be cast "aye, with reservations," and the Chair so ordered.

H.B. No. 2492, H.D. 1, S.D. 1:

On motion by Senator Kokubun, seconded by Senator Ige and carried, H.B. No. 2492, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 22. Noes, none. Excused, 3 (English, Hee, Hemmings).

H.B. No. 2662, H.D. 2, S.D. 1:

By unanimous consent, action on H.B. No. 2662, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING," was deferred until Friday, March 28, 2008

H.B. No. 2954, S.D. 1:

Senator Gabbard moved that H.B. No. 2954, S.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Senator Inouye.

Senator Trimble rose to speak in opposition as follows:

"Madam President, I stand in opposition to H.B. No. 2954.

"Colleagues—at the very least—at least somebody should stand up and say why a bill deserves to be passed. We had three others before this with no discussion.

"But beyond that, this bill would allow an extra \$15 charge to be applied to tow truck charges but only on Oahu, and only for companies that operate continuously. What it really doesn't talk about is that right now the law provides that the towing charge can be \$65—or \$75 if a dolly is used—plus \$7.50 a mile. So let's assume it's a 10-mile drive, plus, at the very least, \$25 for the first day. And so that comes, my friends, to a total of \$175 for a single charge. That seems like quite a bit of money on the surface.

"And if we look around town to see how old and dilapidated the tow trucks are, we find that they're not old, they're not dilapidated, but that they are probably the newest and best that money can buy. There was no testimony presented that these tow truck companies will leave town if this \$15 charge was not applied. And if you figure out what it would cost if a vehicle was towed ten miles and stored a month, it's \$830.

"Finally, the term that is used is 'overtime,' as if the driver the operator of the vehicle—is actually going to receive an additional compensation. There was nothing in the testimony that provided for that. So, because no justification was made that it was needed, because no justification was made that the drivers would actually receive it, I urge you to oppose this law. Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, H.B. No. 2954, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATED TO TOWING," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 20. Noes, 2 (Slom, Trimble). Excused, 3 (English, Hee, Hemmings).
