Statewide Self Help Housing Production by Non-Profits exceeds 1,100 units HICDC, Habitat for Humanity, Self Help Housing Hawaii, and the Consuelo Foundation have been major producers

Self Help Housing Income Targets have typically been low income (USDA Model) or Very Low Income (Habitat); but this leaves out many families who incomes are above 80% of the median but whose ability to purchase homes are way below market rates.
