Chair Oshiro of the Committee on Finance and Chair Baker of the Committee on Ways and Means:

I am Joyce Afalla, a Member of The FACE of Maui Executive Committee. The FACE of Maui is a faith-based, inter-faith community and grassroots organization on Maui. We represent over 20 faith based, inter-faith community organizations and community services organizations on Maui. We reflect the religious, cultural and socioeconomic diversity of our community.

On February 16, 2008, we participated in a first of a kind healthcare summit at the State Capitol to address the crisis in the access and delivery of healthcare to Hawaii's people regardless of their socio-economic status. As a Maui organization we are now aware of some of the contributing factors to our crisis.

- We have the lowest reimbursement in the country which is severely impacting our hospitals and physicians.
- We are one of two states with no Disproportional Share of Hospital (DSP) funding.
- > The HHCS is the only healthcare safety net for our most vulnerable citizens and on the Neighbor Islands, the only choice for our residents.
- > The HHCS is severely impacted by the wait-listed patient problem which not only adds cost to the hospital but also lessens access to hospital beds for those that need acute care.

The FACE of Maui, as a faith-based community grassroots organization believes that the Citizens of the State of Hawaii should all have access to quality education, affordable homes and healthy living with access to quality healthcare and our hospitals, physicians and other providers must be adequately reimbursed. The Legislature must request an early release of appropriated funds and request a loan from the Governor or an advance of additional funds necessary for the HHSC to make it through 2009. We need to protect HHSC while we work together as a community to find permanent solutions to reduce cost and make HHSC more efficient in providing healthcare to our most vulnerable citizens.
