Dear Chair English and Committee Members:

I strongly support the nomination of Brennon Morioka to the position of Director of the State Department of Transportation. Having served in the position, I am familiar with the duties, responsibilities and challenges that will be faced by the Director and Brennon is very capable of assuming this role. I have had the good fortune to work with Brennon when he was my Deputy Director for the Highways Division and I am very familiar with his strengths, capabilities, leadership and ability to work well with business and community members.

Brennon has led the development of significant improvements to our highways program, putting into place major projects designed to address critical highway expansion on all of our major islands. Since his interim appointment, he has led the department's effort to implement the harbors modernization plan, working closely with the Harbors User Group and the Department of Budget and Finance in the development of a financial program to support the effort and conducting informational briefings to acquaint community groups about the need and importance of our commercial harbors and the specific improvements that are being pursued to upgrade facilities under an expedited schedule.

The community outreach he has engaged in is a demonstration of the openness he has extended in dealing with communities affected by our state transportation programs. He has always stressed the importance of assuring public awareness, participation and involvement in development projects. In this respect, Brennon has fostered the implementation of the "context sensitive solutions" approach to projects, a process that emphasizes close coordination and community participation in all phases of projects.

Through such efforts, Brennon has clearly shown his ability to effectively lead the Department in undertaking planning and improvement efforts in a manner that is sensitive to community interests and concerns. As he has done with the Harbors Modernization Program, he has quickly immersed himself in the major improvement effort that is being pursued by the Airports Division. As Interim Director, Brennon has expanded his participation and leadership to direct the on-going airport modernization program and in the effort to upgrade our state commercial harbors he has taken the conceptual and initial planning stages into the coordinated development of both specific legislation and financial strategy to provide the basis for undertaking these critical improvements. His ability to quickly grasp the complexities of the various projects is due to his very impressive engineering background, in which he possesses a Ph.D. in Geotechnical Engineering and his commitment to improving the state's transportation infrastructure in a collaborative and coordinated manner.

While I was the Department's Director, we sought to improve the overall capability and operational effectiveness of the Department through focused goals and objectives. This effort was aimed at improving the financial strength of our respective Divisions to enable the upgrade of our transportation infrastructure through repair of existing facilities and the development of additional improvements to increase capacity and efficiency. A third major area of focus was our effort to expedite the implementation and completion of projects. The fourth area of focus was improving customer service. Brennon committed himself to these objectives as a Deputy and now as a Department Director continues to pursue these objectives.

In his oversight of the Department Brennon has worked closely with the building and construction trades industries and with all segments of the transportation industry. Because of his sincerity and open and accessible manner he has gained trust and support from all quarters.

Brennon's leadership during times of emergency has been demonstrated on a number of occasions. He oversaw the expeditious repair of highway damage experienced in the Kiholo Bay earthquake; the Waimea Bay rockslide and more recently the emergency replacement of the Wainiha Bridge on Kauai. In each of these incidents, Brennon assumed immediate command of the situation and coordinated repair with our state crews, contractors and county and state government agencies.

It is a testament to his capability that he is highly respected by the staff of the department, state, County and federal officials and members of industry and the community. It was my pleasure and good fortune to have the opportunity to work with Brennon as a part of the DOT team during my tenure and I know he will continue to provide the type of direction and leadership that the Department needs in the years ahead.

My name is Lawrence M. Reifurth, and I am the director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("DCCA"). I am testifying **in strong support** of Brennon Morioka's nomination to the position of director of the Department of Transportation ("DOT").

Brennon Morioka currently serves as the DOT's Interim Director. He was appointed to this position in December 2007, when Barry Fukunaga was appointed as the Governor's Chief of Staff. Mr. Morioka served for three years as the Deputy Director of the DOT's Highways Division.

Chair English and members of the Committee, my name is Brian Sekiguchi and I am the Deputy Director of the Department of Transportation (DOT), Airports Division.

I have had the pleasure of working with Mr. Morioka since his appointment as Deputy Director of the DOT, Highways Division in January 2005. As Deputy Directors within the same department, we interacted extensively over the past three years. During this time, he has been a part of the DOT's Director weekly meetings of Airports, Harbors, and Highway Divisions. Through this and as he on occasions served as Acting Director, Mr. Morioka has been involved in Airports Division issues and decision-making matters as they relate to the Airports Modernization Program and the endless operational issues. My name is Wayne Tanaka, Legislative Committee Chair, for Catrala Hawaii which represents the major u-drive/car rental companies in Hawaii and the many businesses which support our industry. Catrala-Hawaii supports the nomination of Brennon Morioka as Director for the Department of Transportation, State of Hawaii.

Although Catrala has not agreed with Mr. Morioka on a number of matters we believe he is a capable leader and has distinguished himself while serving as Deputy Director of Transportation for the Highway's Division the past three (3) years.

In particular we are pleased that Mr. Morioka has honestly clarified for legislators and others that when challenged the DOT cannot validly support the argument that the national daily average for surcharge taxes for udrive (rental) motor vehicles is \$6 a day as assumed and reported by one or more Senators. Catrala has met with the DOT and challenged the \$6 a day figure which is not valid. Hawaii's figure should be \$2 a day like Florida.

As you know, u-drive (rental vehicles) were "singled out" about 9 years ago for a "temporary" \$1 increase in the daily surcharge tax from \$2 to \$3 per day. Last year the tax was suppose to sunset from \$3 to \$2 a day but was extended one year while matters were further explored. It is Catrala's position that if more monies are needed for the highway fund then all revenue sources need to be considered and u-drive/rental vehicles should not be unfairly singled out. If taxes, fees and charges are to be increased, then for udrive/rental vehicles

such increase should start from the base of \$2 and not \$3 since only u-drive vehicles were singled out 9 years ago and the increased was on a temporary basis.

Still further, Catrala-Hawaii supports the position of the Joint Senate and House Task Force which studied the Highway Fund this past summer and concluded that the DOT needs to report in part back to the 2009 legislature how the future needed revenues for the highway fund is to be raised from a variety of sources for various reasons including an anticipated 43% drop off in federal support and subsidies. In keeping with the Joint Task Force recommendation, Catrala supports legislation extending the \$3 one more year (not letting it sunset back to \$2) while the DOT prepares such a report and recommendation for the 2009 Legislative Session. We believe this is a fair approach and consistent with the position of the Joint Senate and House Task Force. We urge you to support this approach. Unfortunately, SB 2501 (which was not referred to your Senate Transportation Committee) in our opinon acts contrary to the Joint Senate and House Task Force and in one of its forms seeks to make the \$3 a day permanent and thus unfairly singles out the u-drive industry.

If one is to "honestly and intelligently" look at destinations competing with Hawaii for tourists and their daily surcharge taxes, Catrala believes Florida is a fair example. In Florida, the daily surcharge tax for udrive/rental vehicles is \$2 a day. Further, many tourists travelling to Florida do not have to travel the minimum 2,500 miles required by tourists seeking to visit Hawaii.

In closing and while we may differ with the opinions of Brennon Morioka on some issues, we respectfully urge you to confirm his nomination since he is an honest, capable and hard working individual and has demonstrated his leadership qualities and abilities these past 3 years as Deputy Director of the DOT. Further, we urge you to be fair to the u-drive industry and its employees by supporting Catrala's position regarding the daily surcharge tax as noted above.
